TROTTER KILLS EIGHT VALUABLE DOGS

Ellet Mountain Bird Dog Breeder, Himself Bitten, is Forced to Kill Eight Suspected of Having Rabies; Dogs Valued at \$1,500.

F. L. Trotter, Pilot Mountain druggist and breeder of pedigreed pointer and setter bird dogs, was bitten a week ago by one of his dogs when two of them developed rabies and attempted to clean up the kennel. The two dogs that went mad were in a kennel with six other valuable dogs and a week ago last Sunday began to bite their companions. Trotter went into the kennel to separate them when one of them bit him.

He immediately sent the head of one of the dogs to Raleigh for examination. The report was to the effect that the dog was suffering from the disease. He thereupon killed the six dogs that had been bitten by the rabid ones. Then he himself began to take the Pasteur treatment for hydrophobia. He does not know whether he was bitten by one of the mad dogs or by one of the dogs that had recently been bitten by them, but he is taking no chances.

Trotter owned a kennel of valuable dogs, his Teddy Burnhill Dan alone is said by local dog fanciers to be worth \$500. The eight dogs killed are estimated to have been worth around \$1500. They are not all of the dogs he owned, as it is known here that he had at least three others out in the country. For some years he is said to have made good money from the sale of his dogs.

Persons coming from the eastern part of the state report hearing of many cases of rabies among the dogs of that section. For some reason springtime is the season when all sorts of distempers afflict the canine family.

NOTICE

North Carolina. Surry County, Town of Mount Airy. Ordinance authorizing the issuance of \$60,000 street improvement bonds of the Town of Mount Airy, North Carolina.

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Mount Airy:

Section 1. That in pursuance of the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (Section 2918 to 2961, Consolidated Statutes of North Carolina, as amended and re-enacted, extra session 1921) negotiable bonds of the Town of Mount Airy, to be known as "Street Improvement Bonds" are hereby authorized to be issued in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$60,000, for the necessary expenses of said Town, to-wit: for the construction and re-construction of hard surface streets in the town of Mount Airy, North Carolina.

Section 2. A tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the bonds hereby authorized shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 3. The following matters are hereby determined and declared pursuant to the requirements of section 2938 of the Municipal Finance Act.

(a) A statement of the debt of the Town of Mount Airy has been made and filed with the Town Clerk pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act and is open to public inspection.

(b) The assessed valuation of property subject to taxation by the Town of Mount Airy for 1923 as shown by said statement is \$6,034,971.00 and the average assessed valuation of property subject to taxation for the three fiscal years in which taxes were last levied as shown by said statement is \$5,897,309.88.

(c) The amount of the net debt of the Town of Mount Airy outstanding, authorized or to be authorized as shown by said statement is \$391,500.00.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be published once in each of two successive weeks after its final passage, as required by section 2944 of the Municipal Finance Act.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its first publication unless in the meantime a petition for its submission to the voters is filed under the Municipal Finance Act and in such event it shall take effect when approved by the voters of the Town of Mount Airy at an election as provided in said Act.

The foregoing ordinance was passed on the 4th day of March, 1924, and was first published on the 8th day of March, 1924. Any action or proceeding questioning the validity of said ordinance must be commenced within thirty days after its first publication.
