PROTECTED DEER GROW TOO NUMEROUS

Measures Taken to Thin Herd of 20,000 Which Have Grown Too Numerous, 2,000 to be Killed Annually

In Arizona's no-man's-land north of the Grand Canyon there is a herd of 20,000 blacktail deer that have been protected until they have grown so numerous that the government authorities propose to license hunters to kill them down in keeping with the available forage. Mount Airy ninerods who may wish to get in on the sport can take the Santa Fe to Grand Canyon, Ariz. and from there enter this little known deer haven by way of airplanes, crossing the 22-mile gorge which is over a mile deep. The following dispatch gives the reasons for thinning out the deer.—Editor.

Albuquerque, Feb. 26.—A committee of game experts, one from each of the principal conservation societies of the eastern states, has been asked by the United States forest service and the United States biological survey to make an inspection of the condition of the blacktail deer in the Grand Canyon game preserve and the Kaibab national forest lying north of the Grand Canyon and to advise as to the future management of the herd, which has grown to the limit of the carrying capacity of the forage.

The two bureaus, which are charged with the administration of these deer, report that unless a limited number of bucks is removed annually through a regulated system of hunting the range may be over-grazed or the herd suffer from starvation or disease. The opinion of outside experts is now desired in order to verify the findings of the government officers as to what should be done.

State Officials Favorable The forest service and the biological survey have already consulted

the state officials of Arizona, and while no final agreement has been reached, it is said that Governor Hunt and State Game Warden Willard believe that a systematic plan for utilizing the natural increase of the deer herd should be adopted. They also believe that the opening of the Kaibab to some system of regulated hunting will lessen the drain on the other deer herds of the state, most of which are in a depleted condition.

The committee of eastern experts is expected to make its examination some time during the coming summer so that the plan finally agreed upon may be placed before the Arizona legislature next winter for ratification.

Could Kill 2000 Forest officials point out that this is one of the few herds of big game in the west which needs thinning down rather than building up. Information thus far at hand indicates that the herd can sustain an annual kill of 2000 bucks indefinitely without any decrease in numbers. Not less than 20,000 deer are believed to range within the Kaibab country.

The proposed plan for opening a part of the region to hunting will not apply to the Grand Canyon national park, part of which lies north of the Grand Canyon. It is planned to retain an ample system of refuges as insurance against the undue decimation of the herd in the Kaibab game preserve and the national forest lying outside the boundaries of the park.

The Kaibab game preserve was created by President Roosevelt in 1906. All hunting has been prohibited since then and predatory animals have been removed by government trappers. The gratifying growth of the herd is pointed out as an example of what big game will do when properly protected and managed.
