OPPOSE PLAN TO UNITE METHODIST

Bishop Candler Believes Northern Church Would Hang Like Blanket Over Southern

Atlanta, Ga., June 21.—Declaring that "the matter before the church is not unification in general but a particular plan which should not be considered upon a mere impulse of sentiment," a joint statement issued here by Bishops Warren A. Candler, Collins Denny and U. V. W. Darlington, W. N. Ainsworth and James F. Dieby, of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, asserted that "however attractive may be some possible conception of unification with the northern branch, it does not follow that the pending plan would fulfill the purpose."

"It has been constantly declared," the statement said, "that the chief ends of unification are to remove 'irritating competition,' prevent overlapping and duplication of work by the two churches, save the needless expenditure of men and means and eliminate unseemly friction and arrest the erection of 'altar against altar.'"

"But none of these desirable objects does this plan propose to accomplish; on the contrary, these objectional conditions are expressly continued by it.

"It must be borne in mind that the northern jurisdiction will be co-extensive with the United States, while the southern jurisdiction will be restricted to the south and west where the Methodist Episcopal church, south now is under plan. The northern jurisdiction will be unlimited and cover the southern jurisdiction like a blanket.

"It is claimed by advocates of the plan that under it there will be a voluntary merger of competing churches and conferences after the two churches are united under one name. What inspired the original organization of northern churches in Dallas, Houston, New Orleans, Louisville, Nashville, Atlanta, Jacksonville, Miami and Tampa? It was the desire for northern fellowship, northern views and northern money to aid their enterprises, and the same things that controlled the original organizations will induce these established congregations to maintain the same relation in the new church. Similar reasons will control many southern Methodists in border territory, where outside pressure becomes insistent, many Methodists will quietly withdraw and unite with other churches.

"It must be noted that that plan effects the repeal of the 'plan of separation,' adopted in 1844 by an overwhelming majority and pronounced valid and binding with this United States supreme court. Our northern brethren undertake to justify their unceasing infraction of this plan by stating that conditions have altered since its adoption. To this it is sufficient to reply that no change of situation can nullify a contract once rightly made.

Don't Want Negro Bishops
 "If the 'plan of separation,' by which we hold all the property of the church south obtained prior to 1844 be repealed, to what substitute for it can we look, and upon what can we depend?"

"Moreover, the plan proposes a relation to the negro not best for him and not possible for us. It calls for the acceptance by our people of two negro bishops.

"We object to this plan because it denudes the annual conferences of their powers. Our brethren have never been willing and they ought never to be willing to turn their rights and duties to the general conference.

"There are many other dangerous and even obnoxious features in this plan, but for the lack of space and especially because of the precipitancy with which the general conference was called, these features and others must be left to the consideration of the called session of the general conferences and the annual conferences.

Storms and Heat Take Heavy Toll of Lives

Chicago, June 20.—Storms and heat in the Mississippi and Ohio river valleys during a period of 24 hours ending tonight took a toll of more than a dozen lives and caused injury or prostrations to more than a score of others, and property loss estimated at more than \$2,000,000.

Northern Illinois and southeastern Wisconsin suffered most from the wind, hail and rain. From northern Indiana came reports of heavy losses due to heavy rains and winds.

Ohio and Michigan late in the day still suffered from the heat, however, and 14 deaths were reported in the Buckeye state alone.

TOWN ORDINANCE

Be it ordained by the board of commissioners of the town of Mount Airy in regular session this day held at the Town Hall in Mount Airy, N. C.

1. That the owners of real estate within the boundaries hereinafter set out be and they are hereby required and directed to curb and pave the sidewalks, on both sides of said street where the same has not already been done as herein directed, and of the widths hereinafter set out, as the same runs in front of their respective lots, such paving to be Granolithic, of the grade to be directed by the Street Foreman, and of the widths hereinafter mentioned.

2. That this ordinance shall apply to Kerner Street, from its intersection with Main Street to its terminus. That the widths of the sidewalk shall be at least five feet.

3. That the real estate owners shall conform with the grade established by the Board of Commissioners as indicated by the curbing to be placed thereon.

4. That the cost of this work shall be paid by the several real estate owners, according to the lineal feet frontage of their respective lots, except the sum of 20c per lineal foot of curbing, which shall be paid by the Town of Mount Airy, provided the Town of Mount Airy shall do the necessary grading and set the curbing.

5. That if any real estate owners shall fail for thirty days thereafter to do such paving and curbing, that the same shall be done by the Town of Mount Airy, and the cost shall be charged against the delinquent as provided for in Chapter 423 in the Private Laws of the Legislature of 1889, entitled, "An act to Amend the Charter of the Town of Mount Airy" and also in Chapter of the Private Laws of the Legislature of 1911, entitled, "An act to amend the Charter of the Town of Mount Airy."

6. That the twenty cents per lineal foot for the curbing to be paid by the Town shall not be paid until after the sidewalk has been completed.

7. That the material to be used and the proportion in which it shall be used shall be the same as is set out in Section 31 of Chapter 2 of the Ordinances of the Town of Mount Airy adopted by the Board of Commissioners May 1st 1909, and that all work shall be done subject to the inspection of the Street Commissioners and Civil Engineer.
