Unfavorable Weather Has Put Wheat Price to Higher

Washington, July 23.—Unfavorable weather and speculative buying of large volume advanced grain prices to new high levels during the week ending July 19, according to the weekly grain market review of the United States department of agriculture. The demand for cash grains, however, became less active toward the close of the week and the market appeared to be developing a weaker tone.

Reports of very unfavorable weather in the Canadian spring wheat area and in some sections of the United States contributed largely to the advance in the wheat market but the heavy speculative buying also aided in forcing wheat prices to new high levels. July wheat at Chicago advanced 10 cents for the week closing Friday. The advance at Winnipeg was slightly larger, July closing there at \$1.36 1-2.

The movement of new wheat to the southwestern markets, particularly Wichita and Kansas City continued heavy but general rains in the central west late in the week stopped threshing and the movement may show some falling off, although country elevators report heavy stocks on hand.

There was an excellent demand early in the week both from local and northwestern mills but premiums toward the close of the week were being reduced when mills were unable to effect any material increase in their flour sales. Spring wheat premiums at Minneapolis were reduced about 5 cents per bushel and the premiums on hard winter wheat in southwestern markets were also lowered materially. The new high levels reached during the week restricted buying. Many mills were taking only sufficient wheat for their immediate needs and elevator interests and other buyers were reported to be less active feeling that the present level was higher than the general market situation warranted.

First Car New Wheat

Threshing was becoming more general in the soft winter wheat territory. The first car of new wheat arrived at Cincinnati during the week and the first car of Nebraska wheat was received at Omaha.

The corn market also continued its steady advance during the week, and July prices at the close on Friday at Chicago showed a net gain for the week of 2 1-4 cents. Weather conditions generally in the corn belt, however, were more favorable and the crop made good progress in most sections. Because of the lateness of the crop, however, it is feared that a large percentage will not mature properly and the bullish sentiment in the market was strengthened by this sentiment.

There was a good cash demand throughout the week and while receipts were of moderate volume, they were readily absorbed upon arrival at the markets. The higher prices were forcing feeders to use substitutes and farmers are also reducing their feeding requirements. Increasing livestock sales were reported from the principal markets and the stock arriving also showed the effect of less grain.

Sales of about 1,500,000 bushels of Argentine corn were reported sold to come to this country and a like amount to go to Canada, but this corn will probably be used principally at seaboard markets. California buyers have turned more to barley since corn prices have become so high. Prices at the central western markets continued around \$1.08 to \$1.10.

MOTHER AND SON KILLED AT AN ELECTRIC WASHER

Powerful Currents in Water Soaked Ground Fatal to Farm Family

Glenn Linn, Va., July 11.—Powerful electric current, present in the water soaked ground around a washing machine caused the death of two persons and injury to two others near here. The tragedy occurred on the farm of James A. Davis, an employe of the Appalachian Power company, where the machine was being operated.

The dead are Mrs. James A. Davis and her 17-year-old son, Ebbie. The injured are Mr. Davis and Dewey Davis, 20-year-old son. At the hospital in Pearisburg where the injured are being treated it was said tonight that they sustained serious burns.

According to eye witnesses, Dewey, who was operating the machine observed that the motor was getting hot. As he approached it to ascertain the trouble he was thrown suddenly forward, falling over the machine onto a hot water pipe that ran through the yard. His father ran to his assistance but he, too, was thrown to the ground, on his face as he neared the machine. Mrs. Davis was the next victim. As she sought to help her husband and son she was knocked over backward and almost instantly killed. Ebbie, then attempted to pull the bodies of his parents and brother back from the machine and suffered a similar fate when he was thrown into a ditch nearby.

Assistance was summoned by other members of the family and the bodies at length recovered. Mrs. Davis and the younger son were dead while Mr. Davis and Dewey were found unconscious, and severely burned.
