LABOR DECIDES ON LA FOLLETTE

Legislative Committee of American Federation Is Unanimous in Choice.

Atlantic City, Aug. 2.—The American Federation of Labor tonight formally endorsed Robert M. La Follette as presidential candidate over Calvin Coolidge and John W. Davis, the Republican and Democratic standard bearers.

The endorsement came in the unanimous adoption by the legislative committee of the report of the federation's non-partisan political committee which favored La Follette and the platform upon which he is making his race.

The report of the executive council was not made public, Samuel Gompers, veteran president of the federation, explaining that time was too short to complete the final draft tonight but that the council's recommendation to three million members of the organization would be made public tomorrow afternoon.

In granting this support to La Follette and Senator Burton K. Wheeler, his running mate, the executive council made it plain that it was not identifying itself or the federation with the new progressive party, but that merely, in its opinion, La Follette's candidacy offered more opportunity to labor than any of the other presidential tickets. The right to reserve its indorsement of party affiliations was made plain by the council. In other words, the council decided to support all candidates whose records are in line with the federation's legislative program.

REVIVE TALK OF FLIGHT TO POLE

Believe Next Session of Congress Will Grant Permission for Trial.

Washington, Aug. 2.—With army aviators thrilling the world with their practically accomplished flight around the world, the United States Navy to-night revived the long projected dash over the North Pole in a dirigible balloon.

Officials declared their belief that the next session of Congress would authorize the journey and that sometime during the coming summer one of the navy's big rigid type airships would soar over the frozen North to give man his first sight of the Pole from the air.

The Navy will have available two rigid airships, capable of making seventy miles an hour or more and fully able to make the North Pole flight—the Shenandoah, in which the trip was originally planned, and the ZR-3 a Leviathan of the air, nearing completion for the government in the Zeppelin plan at Friedrichshafen, Germany.

Officials may decide to abandon the Shenandoah for the Polar dash, and use the ZR-3. The new balloon, which will sail for the United States probably sometime in the autumn, is equipped for long voyages with all the luxuries of her sister of the seas, the Leviathan. The ZR-3 could carry a larger party of scientists and observers than could the Shenandoah, according to Navy authorities.

Plans for the reception of the ZR-3 are taking shape. Test flights indicate an early departure for the United States.
