Notice Street Improvement Bonds. Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Mount Airy, N. C.

1. Bonds of the Town of Mount Airy shall be issued for the purpose of constructing or reconstructing streets in said town of brick blocks, sheet asphalt, bitulitic or bituminous concrete laid on a solid foundation or of concrete.

2. The maximum aggregate prin- cipal amount of the bonds shall be \$25,000.00.

3. A tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the bonds shall be annually levied and collect- ed.

4. A statement of the debt of the town has been filed with the clerk and is open to public inspection.

5. The bonds are for local im- provements of which at least one fourth of the cost exclusive of the cost of paving at street intersections has been or is to be especially as- sessed and this ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and shall not be submitted to the voters.
