Here another hole was cut in the ceiling and by means of bankets the prisoners let themselve down to the floor, and from there to the ground by means of the stairway was a very simple thing.

For four successive years the grand jury has recommended that cages be just in the jail in place of the present insecure arrangement, but the county commissioners have been deaf to such appeals.
