The force numbers 27,000 men, composed of infantry, cavalry, artillery, engineers and a signal corps. The infantry consists of twenty-seven regiments sixteen regulars and eleven volunteers.

The total infantry force is 21,600 men. In addition there are a battalion of engineers, a detachment of the signal corps. five equadrons of cavalry, four batteries of light artillery, and two bat-teries of heavy artillery.

General Shafter is in chief command of the force, which is convoyed by the battleship Indiana, and the gun-boat Helena, with the training Bancroft, as General Shafter's floating home.


