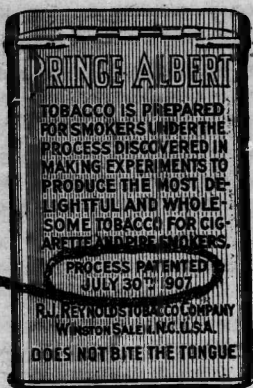

### Prisoners Are Passed Over Border.

El Paso, June 29.—Twenty-three negro troopers of the 10th cavalry and Lem Spillsbury a Mormon scout, captured by the Mexicans at Carrizal and confined in the penitentiary at Chihuahua City, were brought to the border at noon today and turned over to the American authorities.

A shout of laughter rose from the thousands of Mexicans who gathered to witness the arrival of the negroes on the special train.

The prisoners were dressed in the scantiest and most nondescript garbs. Some had on only trousers. One wore a shirt, while a towel encircled his waist. Other's heads were decorated with bandanas.
