## PINEHURST, N. C.,

AND COST OF TRIP.

There are various ways of reaching PINEHURST which may be chosen according to individual preference by boat or by all rail. For one whose main object is to get to his journey's end with as little expenditure of time as possible the best route is by rail.

An evening train leaving New York (Pennsylvania railroad) at 9 o'clock reaches Southern Pines at 5.55 the following night.

A train leaving New York at 11 a. m., by Penn-sylvania railroad, reaches Southern Pines at 4 a. m., which is somewhat early for comfort and convenience.

The Old Dominion Line of steamers from New York, the Bay Line steamers from Baltimore, the Norfolk and Washington steamers from Washington, and steamers on the Cape Charles route, all stop at Portsmouth, Va., and connect with the trains for Southern Pines.

The fare for round trip from New York City to Southern I ines, via I ennsylvania railroad, on any of these routes is \$26.50 and are limited from Nov, 1st to May 31st. Single fare \$16.05.

Fassengers having through tickets, who desire to go by train and avoid night travel, can leave New York at 11 a.m. (Fennsylvania railroad), checking baggage through to Southern I ines, reach Richmond same evening at \$56, spending the night there, leaving Richmond at 9.05 a.m. and arriving at Southern I ines at 5.55 p. m.

One can go by the Cape Charles route, leaving

One can go by the Cape Charles route, leaving New York (Fennsylvania railroad) at 8 a. m., reaching Portsmouth at 8.15 p. m., spend the night at 1 ortsmouth or Norfolk, leave Portsmouth the following morning at 5.25, reaching Southern 1 ines at 5.55 p. m.

An afternoon may be spent in Washington by taking train from New York at 8,00 a, m. (Central Railroad of N. J.), leaving Washington on the evening boat (Nortolk and Washington steamer) at 7 p. m., making close connections with train which leaves I ortsmouth at 9,20 a, m, and reaches Southern I incs at 5,35 p. m.

#### BOSTON PASSENGERS.

Fassengers from Boston can procure round trip tickets, including transfer with baggage across New York City to Pennsylvania railroad, for \$37,59. The train for this route leaves Boston at 1.03 p. m., and Southern Pines is reached at 5.55 f. m. the day following. Round trip tickets from Boston by Fall River Line are \$33, including transfer with baggage in New York City.

The fine steamers of the Merchants & Miners Company leave Battery wharf, Boston, at 2 o'clock on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, connecting at Fortsmouth, Va., with the Seaboard Air Line railroad. By this route a passenger leaving Boston, say on Tuesday, would reach Southern Fines Thursday at 5.55 p. m., having forty hours at sea. Round trip tickets, \$31.75, including neals and berth in stateroom on the steamer.

The Pinehurst Electric Railroad connects with all trains at Southern Pines after Nov. 1st.
