There are also SUITES FOR LIGHT HOUSEKEEPING and SINGLE ROOMS for those who obtain table board at the Pinehurst Casino.

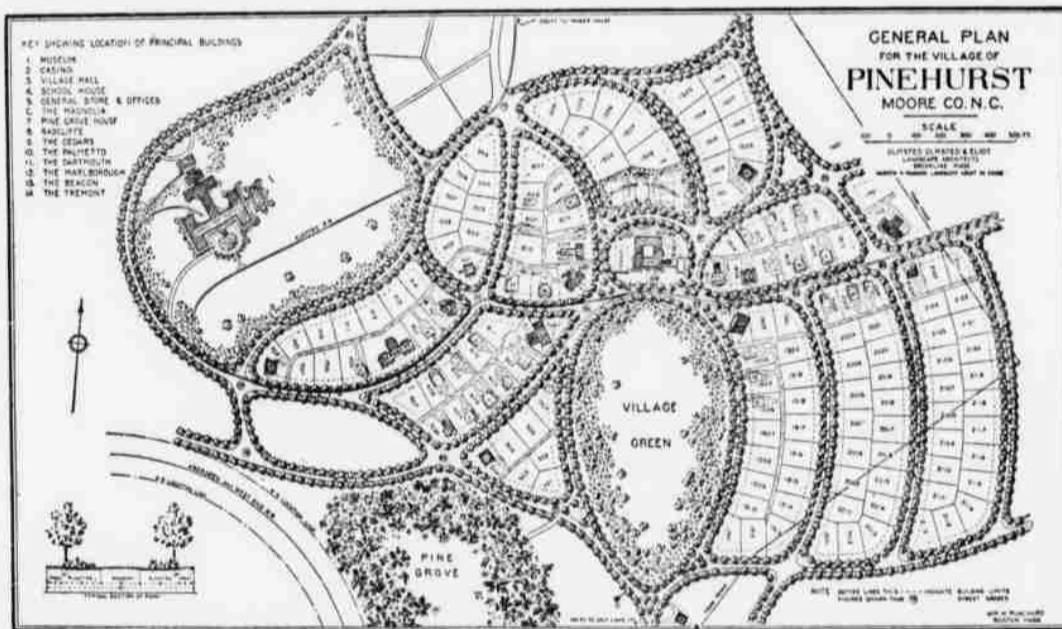

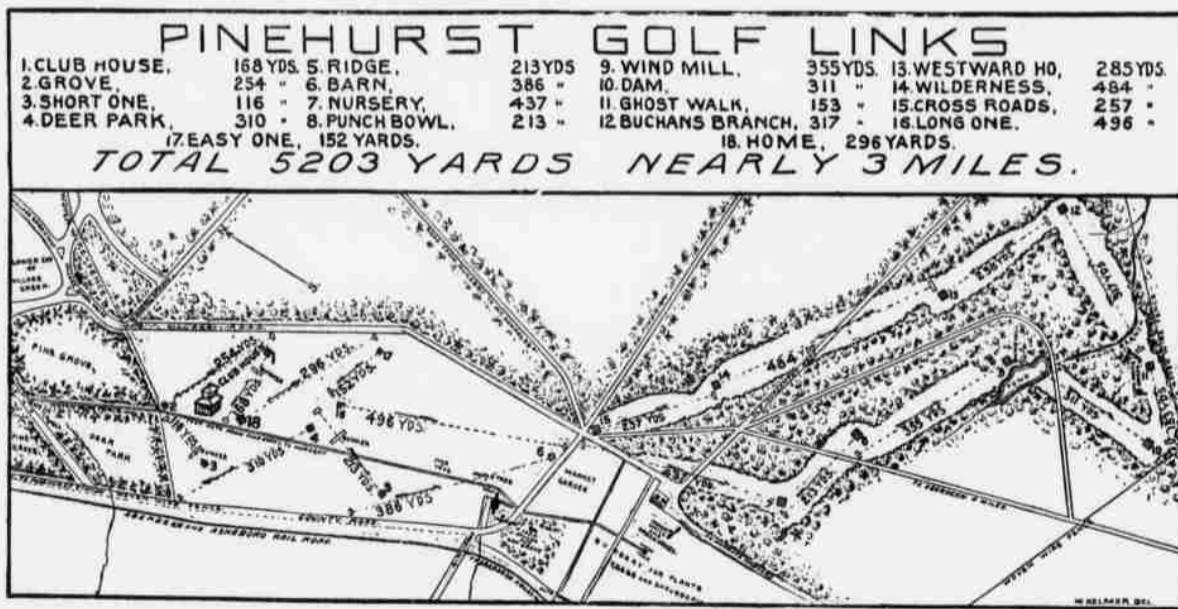

PINEHURST is a Unique Town in the SOUTHLAND

Apparently a Yankee village dropped down in the woods. It is located in the highest and driest part of Moore County, North Carolina, in the well-known sand belt, and among the health giving long-leaf pines. It is 70 miles southwest of Raleigh and 125 miles from the sea coast, at an altitude of 650 feet, and noted for its healthfulness. The village was founded by Mr. James W. Tufts of Boston, in 1895, and consists of fifty cozy cottages, elegantly furnished hotels, boarding and apartment houses, public casino, village hall, schoolhouse, store, museum and other public buildings. The Carolina, the largest hotel in the state, is a magnificent four story hostelry erected this season, with appointments calculated to gratify the most luxurious tastes. The Holly Inn is quiet and home-like, with all modern comforts and conveniences. The Berkshire has been enlarged to more than double its former size, and is up-to-date in every respect. The Casino has a



cafe where excellent table board may be obtained at moderate rates. This building also contains a ladies' parlor, game room and a reading room supplied with the leading periodicals for the free use of the villagers. Bath rooms are also to be found here. The houses are all substantially built, painted and plastered, well furnished and supplied with all modern comforts and conveniences, including electric lights, Pinehurst spring water, and perfect sanitary drainage. Golf experts and all those who cherish the hope of becoming such, will



find excellent opportunity to indulge in the game. The Pinehurst links have recently been enlarged to eighteen holes, carefully laid out and convenient of access, and covers over 150 acres. A professional golfer is in charge and his services as a teacher are available. There are few days, even in the coldest part of the winter, when golf cannot be played with comfort and great physical benefit. There are also croquet grounds, tennis

courts, bowling alleys, trap shooting, billiards, quoits and shuffleboard. The village offers unequalled attractions for refined people at a very moderate cost. Trolley cars connect with Southern Pines, a station on the Seaboard Air Line, eighteen hours from New York City.
