

THE HOLLY INN CUPS !

M. C. Parshall and Roy S. Durstine Take Them With Low Scores.

Sixteen Players Hand in Cards Between Seventy-three and Eighty-three—Field of Fifty Players.

The third event in the winter's program of stated handicap golf fixtures, eighteen-holes medal play, for The Holly Inn cups, offered for the two best net scores, was played Saturday. The field was large, over fifty participating, and the contest a close one.

M. C. Parshall, of Warren, Pa., (20,) won with seventy net, with Roy S. Durstine, of New York City, (16,) only one stroke behind, in seventy-one. The next sixteen players handed in cards between seventy-three and eighty-two, showing conclusively that some excellent work had been done by the handicap committee.

The day was perfect, and this no doubt reduced, many of the cards six or eight strokes.
