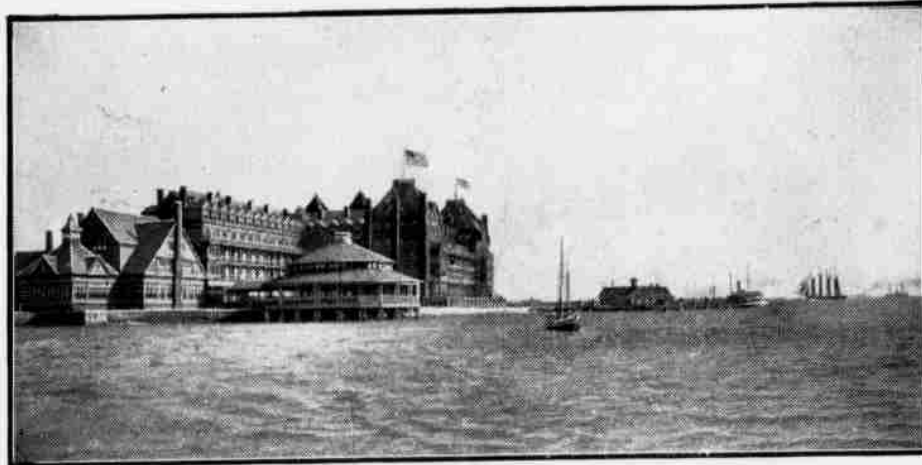

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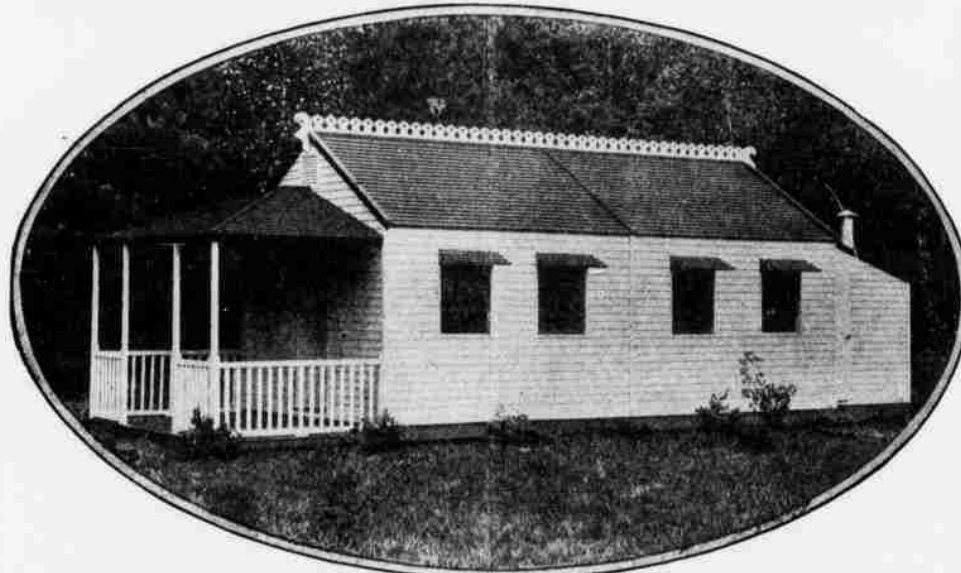

## A VICTIM OF CONSCIENCE.

A Truthful Picture of the Every Day Life of the Jewish People.

"A Victim of Conscience," by Maurice Goldsmith (Henry T. Coates & Co., Philadelphia, publishers) fulfills the promise of the author in the preface. It "Portrays characters but little known and frequently misunderstood; it analyzes a creed at variance with the prevailing faith, and its heroes are humble folk, with intensely human characteristics; with sterling qualities and corresponding shortcomings."

To be sure it has a plot and several courtships are begun and several marriages consummated, but it is a picture of the private every day life of the Jewish people—in business, in church and in society—that the book should be considered and as such it takes its place with the best of its kind.

Had the author eliminated an attempt to create something "exciting" by picturing the remorse suffered by the principal character at killing a worthless drunken sot, the volume would have contained little to criticize. That a sensible man who killed a brute by accident and in self defense, should suffer lifelong remorse for the act, is so far beyond the comprehension of a sensible man as to be positively annoying, if not disgusting.

## F. J. BAILEY WINNER!

Takes Net Score Cup in Saturday's Tournament by Single Stroke.

H. H. Fox of Cambridge a Close Second in Eighty-Eight—The Scores in Detail.

Saturday's eighteen hole handicap medal play golf tournament developed a very close contest between F. J. Bailey of Chicago, and H. H. Fox of Cambridge, Mr. Bailey, winning by a single stroke with a net score of eighty-seven.

## FASCINATING FIGURES.

An Amusement for the Idle, Better than Solitaire.

Here you have some interesting examples of figure juggling:

- 123456789 times 9 plus 10 equals 111111111
- 123456789 times 18 plus 20 equals 222222222
- 123456789 times 27 plus 30 equals 333333333
- 123456789 times 36 plus 40 equals 444444444
- 123456789 times 45 plus 50 equals 555555555
- 123456789 times 54 plus 60 equals 666666666
- 123456789 times 63 plus 70 equals 777777777
- 123456789 times 72 plus 80 equals 888888888
- 123456789 times 81 plus 90 equals 999999999

This table is still more interesting when it is noticed that each multiplier is divisible by 9 and that, when the figures of each answer are added together and the added number is subtracted, the answer is 0. For example, the sum of 111111111 is 10, which minus 10 is 0.

- 987654321 times 9 equals 888888889
- 987654321 times 18 equals 1777777778
- 987654321 times 28 equals 2666666667
- 987654321 times 36 equals 3555555556
- 987654321 times 45 equals 4444444445
- 987654321 times 54 equals 5333333334
- 987654321 times 63 equals 6222222223
- 987654321 times 72 equals 7111111112
- 987654321 times 81 equals 8000000001

In this table it will also be noticed that each multiplier is divisible by 9, and that if the figures in each answer are added together they will form a total, which, if added together, will equal 9. For example, take the second answer, 1777777778. These figures added together, equal 72, and 7 plus 2 is 9.—London Tit-Bits.
