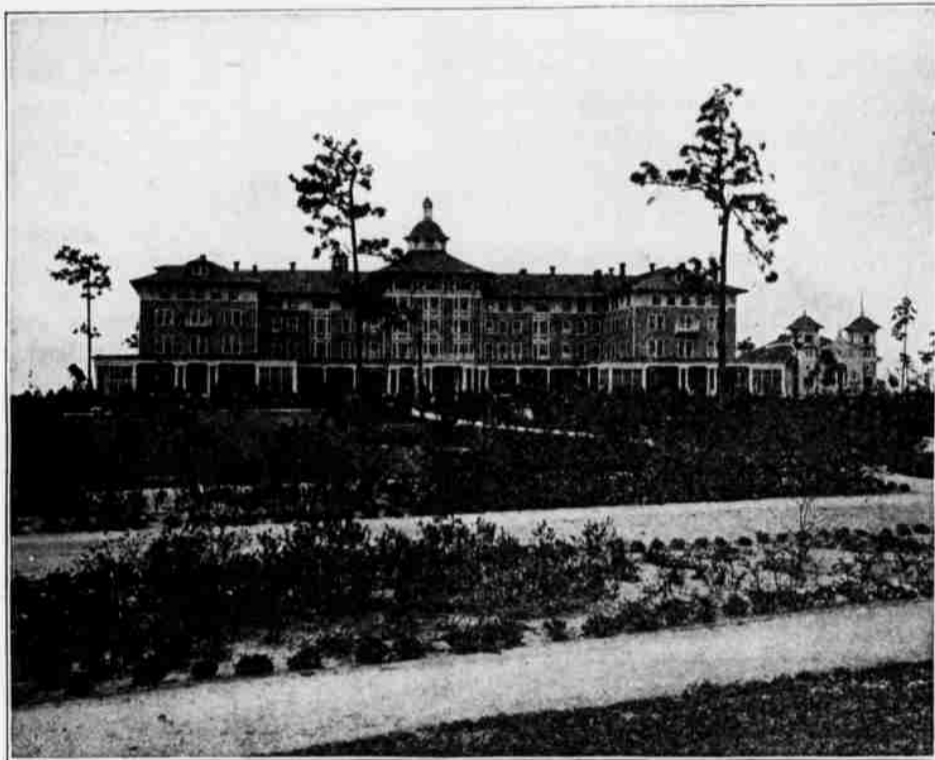


THE CAROLINA
