Happy Thought Which was Much Appreciated by Visitors.

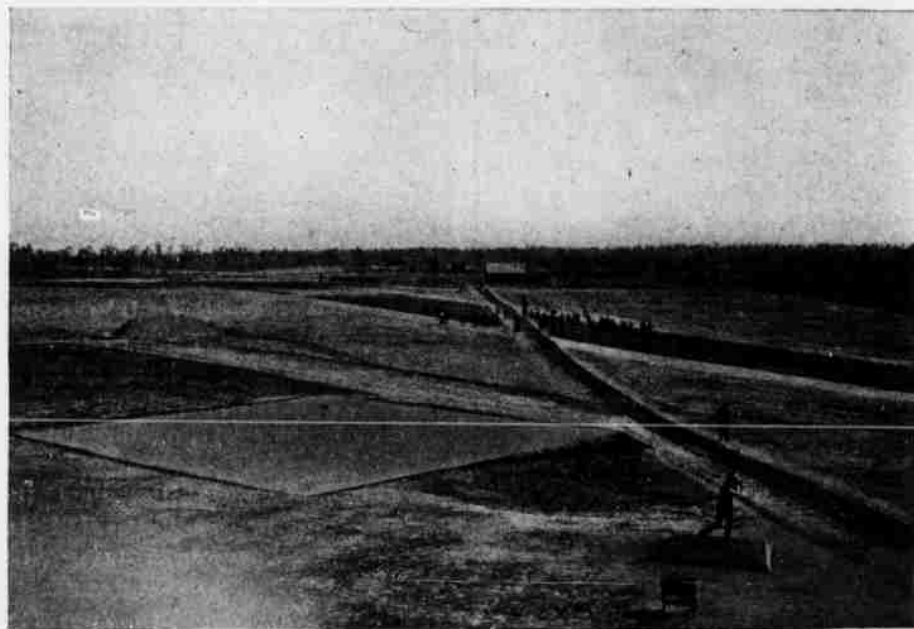
C. L. Becker, Dr. F. Shavior and T. P. Anderson, Jr., are Division Cup Winners.
