TIN WHISTLES CHAMPIONSHIP

C. L. Becker Wins Pinehurst Outlook Trophy in Qualification Play With Card of Eighty-Four.

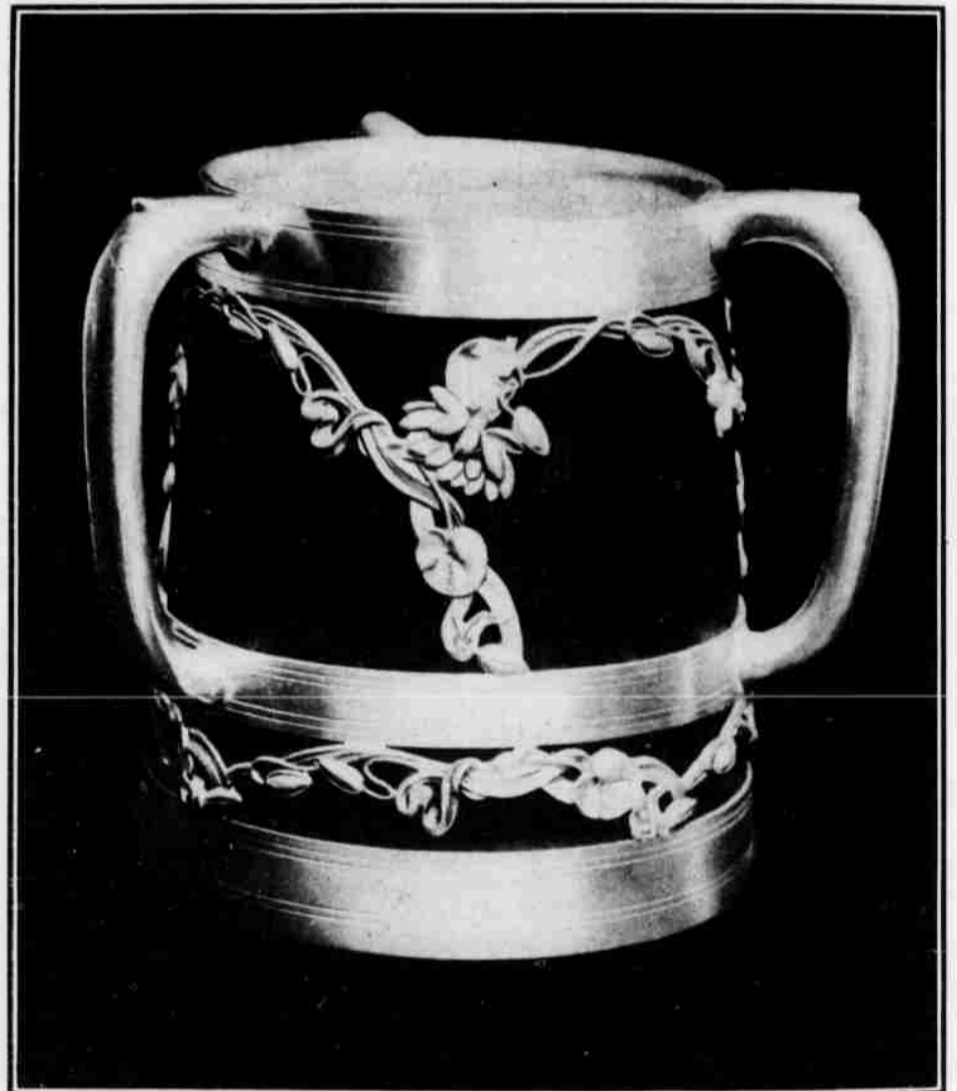


THE Tin Whistles Match Play Club Championship Tournament, which ended early in the week, proved the most interesting of the informal events of the season, J. D. Foot, Rye, N. Y., winning the final round from Allan Lard, of the Columbia Golf Club, Washington,

was a medal play handicap for a handsome bronze trophy offered by THE PINEHURST OUTLOOK for the best net score, which was won by C. L. Becker, of Boston, whose handicap was seven, and who scored 77 net. Mr. Becker also made the best gross score of the day, with Mr. Foot a close second.

Lard was one down at the turn, and three to the bad after twelfth; but he took the thirteenth and fourteenth holes in order, halved the fifteenth, sixteenth and seventeenth, evening the score on the eighteenth, five—six. The nineteenth hole, however, he lost six—five.

The medal play scores for the eighteen holes were eighty-three each, and eighty-eight for Foot, and eighty-nine for Lard for the nineteenth.
