Bowling League Matches Hotly Contested as Season Nears Close.

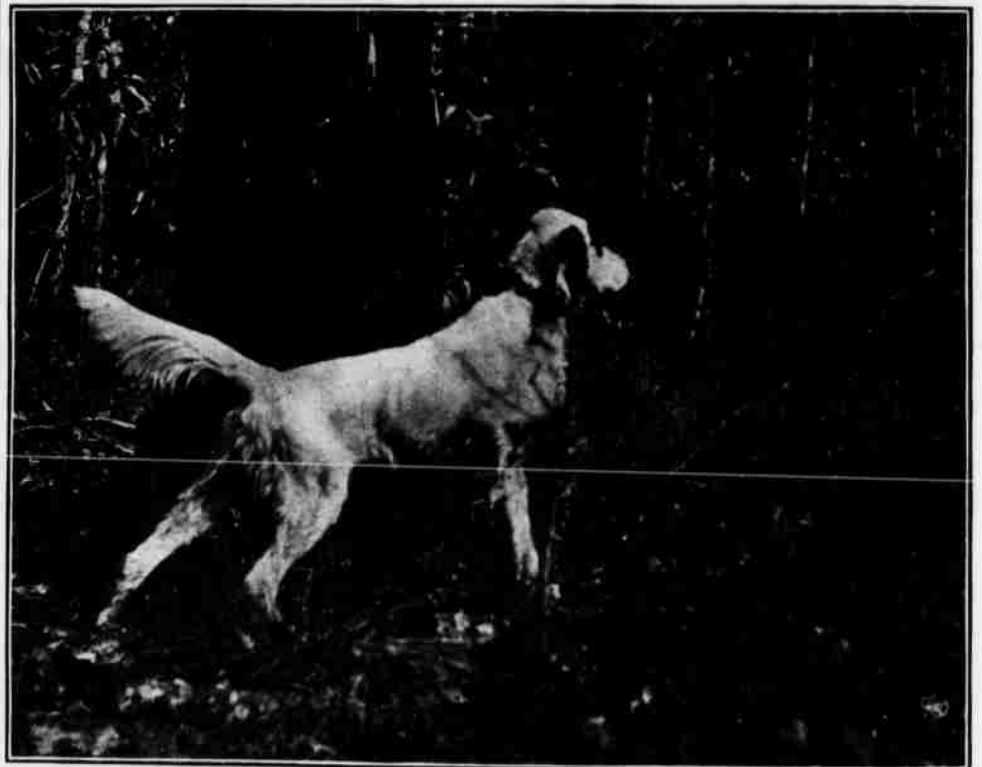
