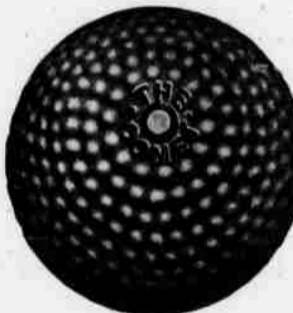

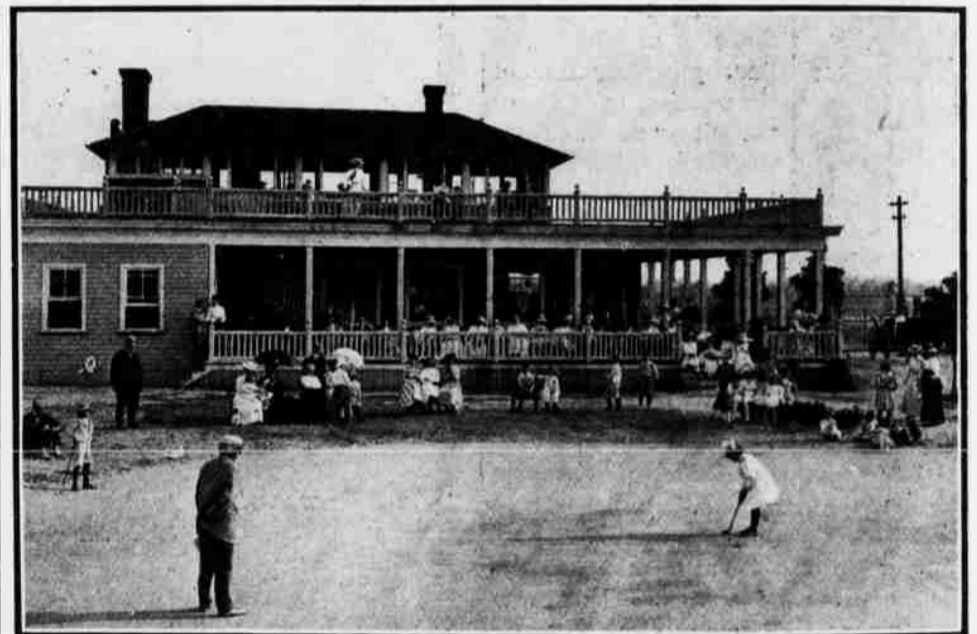
### The Scientist's Scarecrow
