Dates and Rules of Competitions in  
Coming Season's Play at Pine-  
hurst Concretely Set Forth



THE opening of the  
Club for the Summer  
months and the greatly  
increased interest in golf  
manifest this last year  
by the residents of the  
Carolinas has led to  
opening the formal  
tournament season a  
couple of weeks earlier than previously.  
The first competition will be on November  
10, for the benefit of the many Carolina  
players developed here and throughout  
the Carolina Association.

Here is a complete schedule of golfing  
events, the rules of entry and handicaps  
and prizes as handed us by the governors  
of the Pinehurst Country Club.

THIRTEENTH ANNUAL AUTUMN TOUR-  
NAMENT.—November 21 to 25.—Ster-  
ling Trophy for best qualification score.  
President's Trophy to winner of first six-  
teen; Governors' Trophy to winner of  
second sixteen; Sterling Trophies to first  
division runner-up and consolation divi-  
sion winner; silver medals to second  
division runner-up and consolation divi-  
sion winner.

FOURTEENTH ANNUAL MIDWINTER  
TOURNAMENT.—December 28, 29, 30, Jan-  
uary 1, 2.—Gold Medal for best  
qualification score; President's Trophy to  
winner of first sixteen; Governors' Trophy  
to winner of second sixteen; Secretary's  
Trophy to winner of third sixteen; Treas-  
urer's Trophy to winner of fourth six-  
teen; also sterling trophies to division  
runners-up and consolation division win-  
ners. Special consolation tournament for  
those failing to qualify.

THIRTEENTH ANNUAL ST. VALENTINE'S  
TOURNAMENT.—January 30, 31, February  
1, 2, 3.—Gold Medal for best qualifi-  
cation score; President's Trophy to  
winner of first sixteen; Governors' Secre-  
tary's, Treasurer's, Captain's and Club  
Trophies to winners of next five sixteens;  
trophy to winner of seventh and  
eighth sixteens; sterling trophies to  
first, second and third division runners-up  
and consolation division winners; silver  
medals to division runners-up and con-  
solation division winners in the fourth,  
fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth divisions.  
And special consolation tournament.

ELEVENTH ANNUAL ST. VALENTINE'S  
TOURNAMENT FOR WOMEN.—February 7,  
8, 9, 10.—Qualifying round and finals,  
eighteen holes on the morning of each  
day. One or more eights to qualify;  
eighteen holes to be played each day.  
Gold Medal for best qualification score;  
sterling trophies for winners and runners-  
up in each eight.

THIRTEENTH ANNUAL SPRING TOURNA-  
MENT.—February 26, 27, 28, March 1, 2,  
3.—Qualifying round, thirty-six holes;  
finals, thirty-six holes, in first division  
only; eighteen holes in all other divisions.

Gold medal for best qualification score;  
President's, Governors' Secretary's  
Treasurer's, Captain's and Club Trophies  
to winners of first six sixteens;  
trophies to winners of seventh, eighth,  
ninth, tenth, eleventh and twelfth divi-  
sions; sterling trophies to first, second,  
third, fourth, fifth, sixth and seventh  
division runners-up and consolation divi-  
sion winners; silver medals to division  
runners-up and consolation division win-  
ners in the eighth, ninth, tenth, eleventh  
and twelfth divisions. There will also be  
a consolation tournament.

FIFTEENTH ANNUAL UNITED NORTH  
AND SOUTH AMATEUR CHAMPIONSHIP FOR  
WOMEN.—March 24, 26, 27, 28, 29.—  
Qualifying round and finals, eighteen  
holes to be played on the morning of each  
day, four divisions of eight to qualify.  
Gold medal for best qualification score.  
Championship Trophy to winner of first  
eight; Governors' Secretary's and Treas-  
urer's Trophies to winners of next three  
divisions and Sterling Trophies to the  
runners-up and consolation winners in  
each division.

SEVENTH ANNUAL AMATEUR-PROFES-  
SIONAL.—March 30.—Four ball best ball  
match. First prize \$100; second, \$50;  
third, \$25. Trophy for amateur in lead-  
ing Amateur-Professional pair. Ama-  
teurs paired together winning a prize will  
receive value in plate.

SEVENTEENTH ANNUAL UNITED NORTH  
AND SOUTH OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP.—March  
31.—Thirty-six holes medal play; ama-  
teurs winning to receive a trophy. First  
prize for professionals \$150; second prize,  
\$100; third, \$75; fourth, \$50; fifth, \$25.  
Player making best score receives cham-  
pionship gold medal.

SEVENTEENTH ANNUAL UNITED NORTH  
AND SOUTH AMATEUR CHAMPIONSHIP.—  
April 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7.—Qualifying round  
and finals, thirty-six holes. Gold medal  
for best qualification score; Champion-  
ship Trophy to winner of first sixteen;  
Governors' Secretary's, Treasurer's Cap-  
tain's and Club Trophies to winners of  
next five sixteens; sterling trophies  
next five sixteens; sterling trophies to  
division runners-up and consolation divi-  
sion winners in all divisions. Thirty-six  
hole match play finals in first division only.

NINTH ANNUAL MID-APRIL TOURNA-  
MENT.—April 17, 18, 19, 20, 21.—  
Qualifying round and finals, eighteen  
holes. Sterling Trophy for best qualifi-  
cation score; President's Trophy to win-  
ner of first sixteen; Governors' Trophy  
to winner of second sixteen; Sterling  
Trophies to first division runner-up and  
consolation division winner; silver medals  
to division runner-up and consolation  
division winner in second division.

#### REQUIREMENTS

In sending or making entries, please be  
careful to give full name, club member-  
ship, and city or town address. Kindly  
make entries as far in advance as possi-  
ble. Post and telegraph entries are both  
accepted.

The charge for the use of the links and  
courts is one and a half dollars by the

lars by the month and thirty dollars for  
the season. Children under fourteen, one-  
half rates. Season tickets for member's  
wife and children under twenty-one years,  
ten dollars.

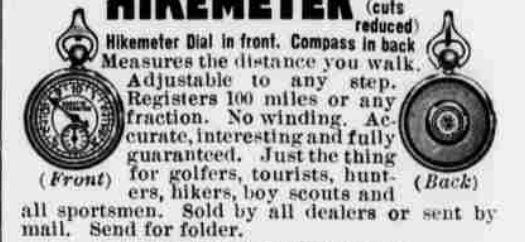
