**A CRIMSON TRIUMPH**

**The Reds Demolish the Blues in Annual Team Match.**  
**L. D. PIERCE LEADS**  
 A Great Field in the Contest versus Bogey on the same Day, Finishing 6 up, with a gross 77.

The annual Team Match of the Tin Whistles was won by the Reds by the broad margin of 8 points, figured on

the Nassau System. This is the first time that either side has won by more than a single point, in any match in which scoring was done by the Nassau method. The Reds were two matches behind the Blues, before this last one was played. Of the eight team contests so far played, the Blues have won 3, the Reds 2, and the other three were tied.

In connection with the team event the 70 odd players took part in the usual battle against bogey at club Handicaps. L. D. Pierce carried off the first prize, at 6 up, and J. H. Clapp and Dr. Carlos F. MacDonald tied for second honors, at 5 up. Pierce and Parker W. Whittemore turned in the best gross rounds, Pierce going over the Number One course in 37-40, 77, and Whittemore in 39-38, 77.
