**A CORRECTION**

EDITOR OF THE PINEHURST OUTLOOK:

I notice in your resume of the proceedings at the Pinehurst Forum held on Sunday, March 7th, the following glaring mistakes:

1. You state that "the significant upshot of the whole evening talk was the substantial agreement of all the speakers, regardless of religion and native locality, in the solution recommended for the prevailing unrest in Ireland: all advocated the establishment of an independent Irish Republic."

2. "Mr. Farley, a Catholic from the Northern Counties....."

3. "It was alleged by each speaker that 80 per cent. of all inhabitants of Erin desire a republic....."

4. "Even the so-called Dominion solution.....was viewed with disfavor by all the speakers."

My reply to the above four quotations from your own resume are:

1. Both Mr. Farley and myself agreed to speak with the understanding that ample time was to be allowed for a public debate. I had to speak first and purposely cut my speech short and merely touched on various aspects of the situation, leaving them to be developed in the debate. Rev. Father Sheedy allowed his Sinn Fein enthusiasm to grow into such boundless lengths that he occupied both his normal speaking time and also that intended for the debate. Mr. Farley, who spoke third had only a very few minutes to express himself.

I do not agree with the proposal to make Ireland a free Republic. I do not think it would be beneficial either to herself, the British Empire or the United States. A weak and defenseless Ireland would be a menace to the whole world, situated as she is on the great trade routes between Europe and America. As an Irishman who loves his country I would be the very first to support an Irish Republic if I thought it would be beneficial to mankind as a whole. Unfortunately or fortunately, as the case may be, Ireland is so geographically located that she must always depend on the protection of some great power. Complete colonial autonomy, or in other words, a government exactly similar to the Dominion of Canada, Australia, etc., with the power and might of the British Empire in the background, is in my opinion the only logical solution.

2. Mr. Farley is not a Catholic. He is a Protestant and Free Mason from the North of Ireland. He has asked me to make this fact clear.

3. I do not believe that 80 per cent. of the people of Ireland want a Republic. The last elections were no indication as the majority of voters were terrorized by the Sinn Feiners. I believe that given a fair chance the great moderate party in Ireland would carry the day for Dominion government.

4. This is answered by the above replies.
