Trapshooters Looking Forward To April Tournaments

A matter of great interest to all shooters is the coming North and South Amateur Target Tournament and the North Carolina State Tournament, both registered with the American Trapshooting Association.

Compared with the Midwinter Handicap, the North and South is in its infancy, but it shows signs of developing into a rival of the great Southern classic held here in January of each year. The great feature of the April Tournament with local fans is the North Carolina Amateur Championship. The winner of this receives not only a trophy but gets his fare paid to and from the Grand American Handicap.

Another interesting feature of the tournament is the shoot between the North and the South, corresponding to the shoot between the East and the West in the January Shoot. Through the courtesy of the E. I. du Pont de Nemours Co., Mr. Luther Squire will personally manage the shoot, and Mr. J. W. Todd will be cashier. The program follows:

Trophies: Trophies will be awarded under the Lewis Class System on the above 75 targets under the same conditions as apply on Monday, except that winners of trophies on Monday will not be eligible to win one of the trophies awarded for this day's program.

Average Money: The 10 High Guns on the total 250 sixteen-yard targets (April 19 and 20) will receive \$100.00 in cash as follows: \$20.00, \$17.50, \$15.00, \$12.50, \$10.00, \$7.50, \$5.00, \$5.00, and \$2.50.

UNITED NORTH AND SOUTH HANDICAP

Tuesday, April 20th:
100 Targets; 5 events of 20 targets each, 16 to 22 yards. Entrance \$10.00. \$50.00 added to the purse and divided High Guns, three moneys for each ten entries or fraction thereof. Entries for "targets only" not accepted. Regular entries close 5 p. m., Monday, April 19th. Penalty entries, \$12.50. Trophy to Winner.

The shooters that have shot through the entire day and the morning of the second day (250 targets in all) will be divided into residents of the Southern part of the United States and those of the Northern part of the United States, the following being considered the upper tier of Southern States: Virginia, Kentucky, Arkansas, Oklahoma, New Mexico, Arizona and California. The aggregate of the five best scores of the Southern Shooters and the five best scores of the Northern Shooters in the 16-yard events will then be computed and a prize given to each of the five on the winning team.

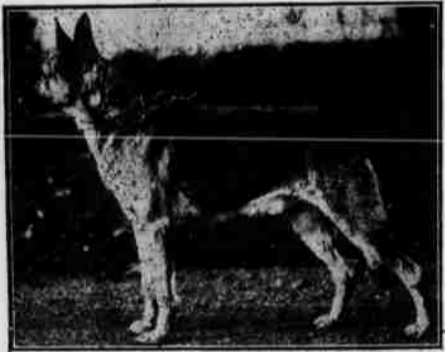
