Adair Wins Qualifying Round, North and South Championship

THE NORTH AND SOUTH Amateur Championship, the last of the North and South events, got under way last Wednesday to a flying start, the field being the largest and classiest that has ever participated in the last Championship of the winter in the Southland. The field of two hundred and seventy starters included several title holders, as well as Francis Ouimet of Boston, former National Amateur and Open Champion.

Perry Adair, the youthful star from the Druid Hills Club, Atlanta, Ga., furnished the surprises of the thirty-six hole play by easily winning the Qualifying honors. A wonderful 72 over the difficult No. 3 course on the final day's play put him in possession of the gold medal by four shots, as his medal of 76 for the first eighteen gave him a total of 148.

Sam Graham of the Greenwich Country Club, Greenwich, Conn., who won the Qualifying Round of the Spring Tournament, followed Adair with a total of 152.

Ideal weather conditions made the scoring very low among the favorites during the first day's play. Sam Graham again proved himself a fine medal player by turning in a 75 for the first round, but this only enabled him to tie for first place, as F. C. Newton of the Brookline Country Club, Brookline, Mass., winner of the Spring event, and J. D. Standish, Detroit, were also around in 75.

Francis Ouimet, the favorite, missed a three foot putt on the last green for his 75 and as a result was forced into a tie for fourth place with Adair. A. E. Ranney, Greenwich, was next in line with a 77, followed by Harold Weber, Inverness, F. S. Danforth, North Fork, and Donald Parson, Youngstown, all of whom had 78.

Adair's exhibition on Thursday when he scored his 72 was one of the finest rounds ever played at Pinehurst during a championship event. He negotiated the outward nine in 35, which included three's on the 4th, 6th and 7th holes and came home in 37 with three's on the 14th, 17th and 18th. Adair's card:

Francis Ouimet found the heavy going on the last day not to his liking and his best effort over No. 3 course was an 80, which placed him in fifth place.

Graham was around in 77 and finished in second place by one shot over J. D. Standish, who had a total medal of 153.

Ouimet's showing in the Qualifying Round was rather disappointing to many. But, then Francis never did care anything about qualifying honors, being satisfied to reserve his best effort for the big honor. In the writer's opinion Ouimet will win the finals without much trouble, as he is playing well within himself.
