

BANKERS' SPECIAL TRAIN

Convention at Carolina May 2-7.

(From the Chicago Banker)

The committee on transportation has unanimously decided on the route for the Spring- tonic Special to Pinehurst. It will leave over the Monon Route from Chicago and over the Pennsylvania from St. Louis. The leaving time will in each case be at 12 o'clock, noon. The two trains will unite at Indianapolis at 5:45 p. m., from which place a special dinner will be served in two diners. Last year the St. Louis cars were obliged to leave three hours earlier. This year's plan will put them on the "New Yorker," an all Pullman limited train. No excess fare to Indianapolis.

From Cincinnati the run will be over the Southern Railway to Chattanooga, where a stop will be made as the guests of the Chattanooga banks. The Southern will leave Chattanooga at 3:00 p. m. for Atlanta. From Atlanta the run will be over the Seaboard Air Line to Pinehurst for breakfast. A special breakfast diner will be carried for emergencies, at order of Mr. Ryan.

Those who wish to go and return by the same route can benefit by the fare and one-half rate. Return via Washington or New York can be made at Winter Tourist rates. This rate saves about eight dollars from Chicago. More from farther west. Passengers can buy New York side trip either at Chicago from the Monon, or, it can be had at Pinehurst with no inconvenience whatever.

The great Indiana Society backed the Monon for the initial haul and really landed it for that favorite Hoosier Route. Circulars and rates will be mailed to all included in the official list. Pullman tickets will be mailed on request. Baggage tags will be sent as usual. The committee thinks it has made better arrangements than ever before. Reservations are about one-half in at this time. Ready for the others.
