## THE HORSE SHOW APRIL 5-6

The annual exhibition of the Pinehurst Horse Show will be held on the grounds of the Jockey Club on Tuesday and Wednesday, April 5 and 6, and from present indications this year's event will surpass even the great show of 1920. Large entries of blue-blooded thoroughbreds are coming in daily, not only from near this section, but from the north and south. Twenty-five classes are on the program, and members and friends of the Jockey Club have donated a handsome aggregation of trophies to be competed for in the different classes.

### APRIL 5. MORNING

Class 1.—*Running Horses in Hand*, (Stallion, Mare, or Gelding) — To be judged by appearance in ring and conformation. Racing performance not to count. To be shown by jockey in colors. First prize, \$20.00; second prize, \$15.00; third prize, \$10.00.

Class 1a.—*Green Polo Ponies*—Special class for green ponies likely to make polo ponies.

First prize, \$20.00; second prize, \$15.00; third prize, \$10.00.

Class 2.—*Pacers in Harness*, (Stallion, Mare, or Gelding)—Three years old and over. Records not to count. To be judged by their conformation and appearance.

First prize, \$20.00; second prize, \$15.00; third prize, \$10.00.

Class 3.—*Trotters in Hand*, (Two-year old class, Stallion, Mare, or Gelding)—Conformation, soundness, and appearance to count. To be shown at the halter.

First prize, \$20.00; second prize, \$15.00; third prize, \$10.00.

Class 4.—*Polo Pony Class*—Light-weight. Performance to count 75 per cent, and conformation, 25 per cent.

First prize, \$20.00; second prize, \$15.00; third prize, \$10.00.

Class 5.—*Saddle Ponies*—Over 12 hands and under 14-2. To be judged by their conformation and manners. To be shown in trot, walk, and canter.

First prize, trophy; second prize, trophy.

Class 6.—*Hunters to Jump*—Heavy-weight up to carrying 220 pounds. Conformation to count 25 per cent; performance, 75 per cent.

First prize, trophy; second prize, trophy.

### APRIL 5. AFTERNOON

Class 7.—*Combination Class*—Horses suitable for use in harness and under saddle. To be shown to vehicle first, unharnessed in the ring, and then shown under saddle. Confirmation not to count.

First prize, trophy; second prize, trophy.

Class 8.—*Best Boy Rider*, (entries close April 4)—16 years of age and under. General appearance of rider, including neatness of dress, erect and easy carriage, hands, seat, and management of horse at walk, trot, canter, and in backing, to count. Contestants will be required to change horses at the direction of the judges.

First prize, trophy; second prize, trophy.

Class 9.—*Saddle Horses*—For horses 14-2 and not exceeding 15-2. To be judged by their conformation and manners. To be shown in walk, trot, and canter.

First prize, trophy; second prize, trophy.

Class 10.—*Hunters to Jump*—Light-weight up to carrying 160 pounds. Conformation to count 25 per cent; performance, 75 per cent.

First prize, trophy; second prize, trophy.

Class 11.—*Children's Pony Saddle Class*—For ponies 12 hands and under. To be shown by children only.

First prize, trophy; second prize, trophy.

Class 12.—*Hunters to Jump*—Middle-weight carrying up to 185 pounds. Conformation to count 25 per cent.; performance, 75 per cent.

First prize, trophy; second prize, trophy.

Class 13.—*Trotters in Hand*, (three-year-old class, Stallion, Mare, or Gelding)—Conformation, soundness and appearance to count. To be shown at the halter.

First prize, \$20.00; second prize, \$15.00; third prize, \$10.00.

### APRIL 6. MORNING

Class 14.—*Trotters in Harness*, (Stallion, Mare, or Gelding)—Three years old and over. Records not to be considered. Performance and conformation to count.

First prize, \$20.00; second prize, \$15.00; third prize, \$10.00.

Class 15.—*Polo Pony Class*—Heavy-weight. Performance to count 75 per cent; conformation to count 25 per cent.

First prize, \$20.00; second prize, \$15.00; third prize, \$10.00.

Class 16.—*Officers' Mounts*—Open to all officers of the regular army; officers
