

and before they have been shown anywhere else. As a result, the demand for seats far exceeds the capacity of the present theatre and hundreds of people have to be turned away from every performance.

Realizing this, the construction of a new theatre building this summer has been proposed. Though all plans at this time are subject to modification, it is hoped that a company can be formed and the necessary money raised by the sale of a bond issue. Preliminary plans of a very attractive building have been drawn by Aymar Embury II, and the cost is estimated at between \$40,000.00 and \$50,000.00.

The plans provide a seating capacity of 835 people—585 on the main floor with a gallery for 250. Shops have been attractively added which should provide a steady income from rent for the new company.

Charles Picquet, who has been running "movie" theatres in the Sand Hills for a number of years, has the plans and is anxious to discuss them with anyone interested in the project and to receive their criticisms and suggestions.
