BRITISH PROFESSIONALS WOULD COME TO AMERICA

A number of leading golf professionals of the younger class in Great Britain are seeking clubs in the United States, according to Fred Kennedy who recently returned to America after spending more than a year in England and Scotland in connection with the golf ball business. Mr. Kennedy has a long list of names of British professionals who asked him to aid them in finding clubs in the United States.

Mr Kennedy reports that many of the older British professionals who recently toured the United States have advised the younger players in Great Britain that they can do better here than in their own country and would "go out" themselves if they were younger. Harry Vardon is among the veteran professionals who are of this opinion. He was greatly impressed with the progress made in American golf and the opportunity here for good instructors and players.

Among the British professionals who would come here if they could obtain berths are Arthur G. Havers of Blundell Sands, rated as the finest of the younger British professionals; James Ockenden of Raynes Park; Arthur Seymour of West Essex; Oudrey Boomer of St. Cloud, Paris; W. B. Smith, Layling Island; A. Kay, Newcastle; Peter Robinson of Braid Hills, Scottish open champion; Fred Leach, Northwood; A. Holland, Northampton, and E. R. Whiteomb, Came Down.

This list includes only the better known of the younger players in the professional ranks. There are many others who desire to locate in America. Salaries are higher here than in Great Britain and there is a larger earning capacity. Three pounds would be considered a good weekly salary in England. This does not compare with the figures paid by large clubs in the United States.

fair it holds. That it is a good kind is shown by the attendance, always bigger each succeeding year, and by the increasing interest apparent in the hog show, the cattle show, the poultry exhibit, and the effect these shows are having on the farms.

But the influence of Pinehurst is wider still, for the good roads of the Sandhills and much of the good road work of the state and of the whole South had its origin in the village where good roads were early seen to be a necessity. For a time Moore county was as prominent for its good roads as it had been for other features, and ever since the first good road was made in North Carolina the Sandhills country has been easy to get about in. The broad road that Mr. Manning has laid down in his plans for the future of Pinehurst, Mid-Pines, Knollwood and Southern Pines, had its inception at Pinehurst. And the list of helpful things done might be continued through a long string. Pinehurst is more than a place where winter visitors may find entertainment and recreation.
