the policy holder may be fined for cheating at golf, cheating at drinking, and cheating at insurance.

IV.—Loss of Nose. (Company not liable. Most golfers have a type of nose peculiar to country clubbers, and are only too willing to suffer such loss.)

V.—Loss of Thirst. In any case where a golfer shall furnish conclusive proof of this, five times the principal sum. Note—We have never lost a cent under this clause.

VI.—Loss of One Eye. If due to strain of looking for one golf ball, one-half the principal sum; if lost looking for a flask, the principal sum.

VII.—Loss of Both Eyes. (Company not liable for any wood alcohol golf tournaments.)—H. I. Phillips in *Southern Golfer*
