

UNCLE SAND DEFEATS OLD RIVAL IN JOCKEY CLUB FEATURE

The event of chief importance on the Jockey Club's program at Pinehurst on Saturday last was the seven furlong flat race, which brought together a high-class band of sprinters, and resulted in a well earned victory for Nat Hurd's good racer, Uncle Sand. Mrs. Leo F. F. Wanner's Mary's Magneto was second and C. L. Whiting's Ravenwood came in third.

G. L. Stevens' Troben, ridden by Burns, captured the five and one-half furlong event in 1:08. Lee Folger's Old Gibb, with Lasses up, saved the place and Miss Helen Waring's Joe Milner was third.

Hill Silk, owned by J. C. Thomas and driven by Sebree, outdistanced the field in the Class B. pace and won first money in successive heats. J. MacKinnon's Baby Ruth finished last in the first heat of the Class A. trot, then won the next two heats in succession, winning first money. Longwood finished second here and Margarite took the short end of the purse.

The steeplechase event, the closing number on the card, was won in impressive style by J. T. Garthright's good jumper Flight Captain, with Miss Waring's Ray-O-Light second.

A large number of amateurs took part in the specialties staged between races, which were amusing and exciting and very much enjoyed by the occupants of the grandstand and boxes.

THREE-BALL MATCH

Feature of Tin Whistles

Forty-six members participated in the qualifying round of the Tin Whistles' annual Three-Ball Match on Monday last, and twenty-seven qualified in the order of their net scores for three days' match-play. A Medal-play tournament was played by those who failed to qualify.

F. H. Mahan led the field in the qualifying round with a net score of 82-10-72. D. P. Morse finished second, at 97-24-73, and Rev. T. A. Cheatham was third, at 85-12-73. H. G. Phillip's 37-36-73 was the best gross round of the day, but he played with a plus 1 handicap and his net 74 placed him in a tie with A. E. Ranney for fifth place.

The twenty-seven players who qualified were then drawn into nine groups of three players each for match play, on a point scoring basis, winners of each group to meet in the semi-final and final rounds. A player wins two points for each opponent he defeats at each hole, thus winning four points if he defeats both his opponents. If a hole is halved each player is credited with one point.
