

KNOLLWOOD VILLAGE

Development at Knollwood follows fast. A year ago the plans were started for the club house and golf grounds at Mid-Pines. That job is so far along that the course is in use and the club house occupied by its members. Now begins the next move.

A. S. Newcomb & Company, have been given a contract to handle the lands on what is to be Knollwood village, and there will be created one of the model communities of the South. Just above the club house toward Pinehurst is a group of some thirty or forty building sites. Of these about fifteen are already sold. The others will follow shortly. Over the Southern Pines way is another group of equally desirable sites. These two groups will constitute the village. Lots are priced at \$1,500 each, with a refund on the first ten lots on which houses are built in the next twelve months.

Between the two groups of lots are the golf course and club house with another course laid out on the opposite side of the road. The village will cluster largely about the golf courses, and be very attractive. A. S. Newcomb and Company will be glad to discuss locations and conditions with prospective buvers.
