### NEW THEATRE BUILDING FOR PINEHURST

As we all know, the moving pictures shown at Pinehurst are the best that are produced, and most of all they are new and the local management gets them just as soon as they are released by the film companies. As a result, the demand for seats far exceeds the capacity of the present theatre and plans for a new building have been perfected. The new building is to be terra cotta walls with brick veneer and a green tile roof, somewhat similar to the new bank building, and is to occupy the site where the printing office now stands. The plans provide for something like 500 seats down stairs with 150 seats in the balcony; four shops on the ground floor opening on the street, and in addition to the picture screen will have an adequate stage where concerts and amateur theatricals may be held. Mr. Aymar Embury, who has drawn the plans for most all the building in Pinehurst, and who is the architect for the new theatre, is very enthusiastic about the building and proposes to make it a modern institution of its kind.
