NORTH CAROLINA BANKERS TO MEET AT PINEHURST

Reservations have been made for some 400 members of the North Carolina Bankers' Association who will gather at the Carolina on April 26, 27 and 28, and with the members of their families who will accompany them it is likely that close to 500 people will be in the party.

The financiers are coming for business sessions and recreation, and that the recreation feature is not to occupy any small part of the program is manifested by the following way the bankers head their program. Here it is:

"Hear Ye! Golf, Tennis and Riding Devotees, Listen!

"In order for you to enjoy the golf, tennis and riding it is absolutely necessary that you bring your golf clubs, tennis rackets and riding habits.

"There are four 18-hole golf courses, four tennis courts, and a large stable of saddle horses."

Mr. Alan T. Bowler, Secretary of the Association, has arranged the program so as to get in all the work possible and yet leave a big margin for play and outing pleasures.

Hon. Robert N. Page, President of the Citizens Bank and Trust Company of Southern Pines, will deliver an address of welcome for the banks of Moore County. Other distinguished visitors to address the bankers will be Senator Dial of South Carolina, Judge C. F. Moore of New York and Walter W. Head of Omaha, Nebr., Vice-President of the American Bankers Association.

The entertainment program is varied and delightful. A reception and dance will be given by the Carolina management on Wednesday evening, and on Thursday evening another dance will be given at the Country Club by the bankers of Moore County. Bridge, putting contests, horse-racing, a shooting exhibition by Annie Oakley, tea and dancing at the Club every afternoon, and automobile rides through the peach section will be some other things to entertain the visitors, and last but not least an old-time Southern barbecue, under the direction of Mr. Ruohs Pyron, a past master at such things, will be held on Friday morning in the grove near the dairy.
