Claude Walker, with Hilcoat up, finished second, and Ray-O-Light came in third.

After Ray-O-Light and Misfit were withdrawn from the steeplechase, the field was reduced to two starters, Kate Glenn, entered by the Red Gables stable, and W. F. Lang's Hindoo, but these good jumpers put up a splendid exhibition of fencing over the mile and half course, with Kate Glenn gaining the verdict.
