**NOTICE OF SALE OF VALUABLE LAND AND VALUABLE TIMBER**  
The undersigned, as Executor of the Will of J. G. Bottoms, deceased, which Will was offered for and admitted to probate on the 20th day of August, 1964, and is recorded in the office of the Clerk of the Superior Court of Northampton County, North Carolina, in Will Book 13 at page 422, pursuant to the directions contained in said Will, will offer for sale to the highest bidder for cash on Saturday, the 24th day of April, 1965 at 12:00 noon, in front of the Courthouse Door in Jackson, North Carolina, the Timber on the following described land and then by separate sales the Land itself, subject to the sale of the timber.

The timber to be sold is as follows: All of the pine and hardwood

timber and trees measuring 11 inches and larger across the stump from outside of bark to outside of bark at ground level, except those required by law to be left for seed trees, living or dead, growing, standing, lying or being upon the following described land:
