## County-Wide Art Festival Was Held At Willis Hare Thursday

PENDELTON — Willis Hare High School gymnasium was the

scene of the first Arts and Crafts Festival ever held by nine Northampton County Schools on Thursday, April 22.

Schools participating were Coates, Creecy, Eastside, Garysburg, Meherrin, Ransom, Squire, Woodland and Willis Hare. The Gumberry High School assisted in planning the festival. The over-all exhibit was excellent and revealed outstanding talent of a number of the students. Registration showed that 1533 pupils and adults attended the festival.

As visitors entered the door of the building, behind the festival registration desk an oil painting of the Willis Hare principal, O. B. Spaulding, greeted everyone with a cheery welcome. The painting was done by John Alex Foriet, a ninth grade Willis Hare student.

John Foriet had four other portraits done in oils and charcoal exhibited in the hallway. Items on display ranged from first grade finger painting to mosaics and oil paintings.

Woodland Elementary School's exhibit featured, among other things, a group of three aluminum paintings of John F. Kennedy, George Washington and Abraham Lincoln done by Calvin Lawrence.

A clay-sculptured head of Delphi, Greek charioteer, dominated the Creecy School exhibit.

The figure was sprayed with gold paint to give it a metallic look. The work was done by the 8-B grade.

An Easter basket and bunny exhibit was the outstanding feature of the Coates School.

Eastside School's display showed three mural paintings on living things in nature. Insects made of peas and beans were also featured here.

A large-size pencil portrait of a person dominated the Garysburg exhibit.

Handwork, including a beautiful array of aprons, and decorative wastebaskets made of cardboard were outstanding in the Meherrin School Display.

Ransom School displayed a lamp made of popcicle sticks and marbles as their outstanding work. A set of false teeth made of clay and corn kernels added humor to their exhibit.

Squire School's exhibit was dominated by a three foot by three foot television which was operated by a rolling screen showing Hawaii, our 50th state. A linoleum print of a dog further made this an interesting exhibit.

The Willis Hare exhibit was set by a large four foot by eight foot mosaic tile scene showing the history of the school. Water coloring, finger painting, paper mache and a mural of island life were also shown here.
