

Bernice Kelly Harris To Return To Chowan In Fall

MURFREESBORO — Dr. Bernice Kelly Harris, N. C. author and teacher, and Dr. Bela Udvarnoki, Professor Emeritus, are returning to Chowan College this fall, it was announced Monday. Other new instructors include Mrs. Undine Weeks Barnhill of Scotland Neck, and James S. Saulman, Morganton.

As has been her practice for a number of years, Dr. Harris will teach creative writing. The non-credit creative writing course is designed to give students an opportunity to express themselves creatively, to write about dramatic elements found in everyday life and their experiences, according to Dr. Harris.

As class projects, Dr. Harris' students have produced a "Literary Supplement," written articles for newspapers and other publications and had a play produced at the State Drama Festival at Chapel Hill.

Coming out of retirement to teach sociology, Dr. Bela Udvarnoki has been Professor Emeritus at Chowan for two years. A native of Budapest, Hungary, Dr. Udvarnoki was president of the Hungarian Baptist Convention from 1936-39 and was featured speaker at the Baptist World Alliance Meeting in Berlin in 1934.

He has written extensively. He joined the Chowan faculty in 1952 and became a United States citizen in 1955.

Mrs. Undine Weeks Barnhill will join the English Department.

She received her bachelor of arts degree in English and history from Meredith College and master of arts from East Carolina College. Mrs. Barnhill has traveled through the Middle East on a study tour conducted by Lafayette College, Easton, Pa., and has done research and study at Harvard University.

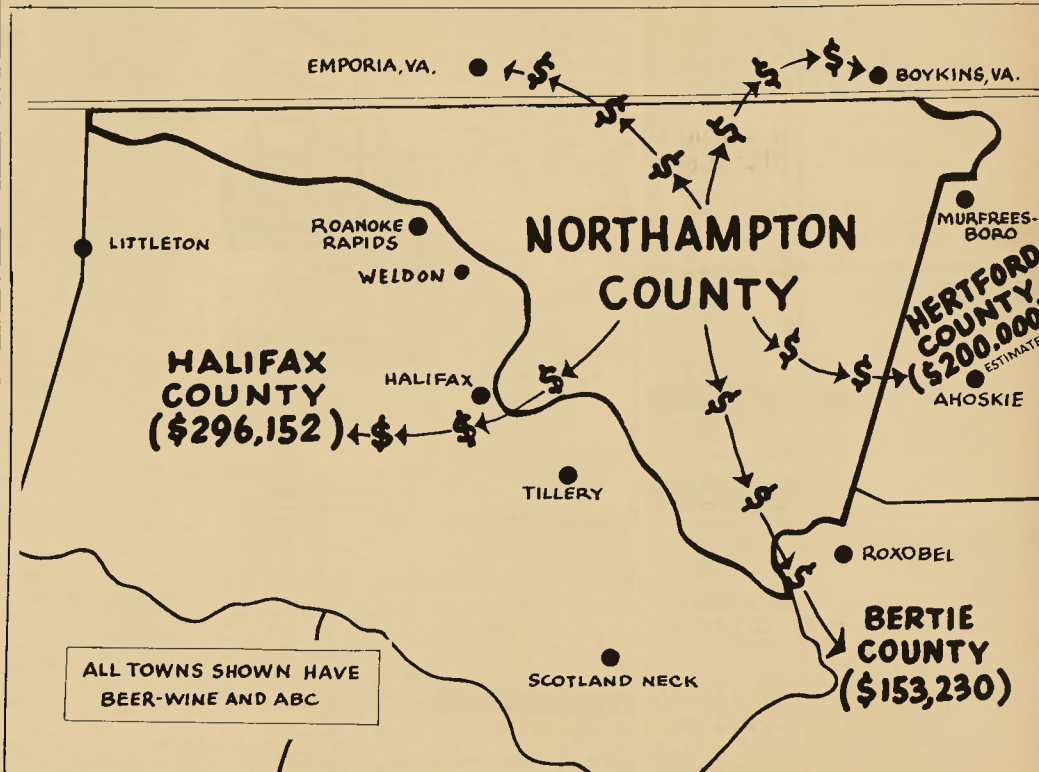
