**Woodland Tigers Defeat Rich Square Tornadoes**

RICH SQUARE — The Woodland Tigers, surviving a 42-14 romp by Ahsokie, fought back Saturday to whip the Tornadoes of Rich Square, 32-14.

The Tigers took the opening kickoff and roared through the defense of Rich Square, picking up three first downs and then sending fullback Bobby Hartly 26 yards around the end for a score. The PAT failed.

The Tornadoes struck back quickly with Mike Johnson taking the kickoff and racing 70 yards for a touchdown. The PAT failed.

Woodland again took the kickoff and picking up three more first downs shot Danny Joyner 15 yards around the end for a touchdown. The PAT failed.

Late in the second quarter found the Tigers clawing away again at the Tornado defense. Donnie Joyner passed 55 yards to halfback Danny Joyner and the score. The PAT failed after touchdown failed again for the Tigers.

Opening up the second half the Tornado offense began to sulk. The Tornadoes drove to four first downs before quarterback David Brown pitched back to Mike Johnson who circled right end for 20 yards and a score. The PAT failed for the Rich Square eleven.

Once again Woodland was recapturing the kickoff who this time drove 50 yards in three plays before sending Danny Joyner 20 yards around right end and the score. The PAT by Bobby Hartly was good.

In the fourth quarter Woodland was pounding the Rich Square defense again, as Donnie Joyner passed 30 yards to Danny Joyner for a touchdown. Fullback Hartly ran the extra point.

**Tornadoes Roll To 39-6 Victory Over Jackson Team**

RICH SQUARE — Rich Square's football team, on a cold Wednesday afternoon, forgot about previous mistakes and moved to a 39-6 victory over Jackson.

They ran hard, blocked good, passed with accuracy, and threw up the tightest defense the whole season.

The Tornadoes opened up with halfback Frank Bracy getting key blocks from Thomas Brown and Mike Johnson and riddled off 65 yards for a touchdown. The PAT failed.

Following the Jackson kickoff Mike Johnson returned his second kickoff return of the year for 85 yards and a touchdown. The PAT failed.

The Jackson Hornets took the

kickoff getting no yardage against the tight defense of the Tornadoes. They were forced to punt.

Three plays later Frank Bracy slipped off tackle and raced 55 yards for a touchdown. Bracy also ran the PAT.

Opening the second half, the Tornadoes were blowing away as Mike Johnson passed 25 yards to Floyd Jenkins for a touchdown. The pass from Johnson to Jenkins was good for the PAT also.

Again in the third quarter, middle linebacker Thomas Brown recovered a Jackson fumble. Mike Johnson, on the first play, raced 33 yards around the end for a touchdown. Bracy got the PAT.

Late in the fourth quarter defensive linebacker David Brown killed a Jackson drive by intercepting a pass to set up Rich

**FENCING TIPS: GOOD CORNERS**

- 1 Set corner posts, along with 2 or 3 approach posts. Drill holes in posts near tops for brace supports.
- 2 Drill holes into ends of brace posts; insert spikes with heads cut off. Attach brace by inserting spikes into holes. Braces should be parallel to ground.
- 3 Staple brace wires to bottom and top of posts, as shown, for long lasting corners.

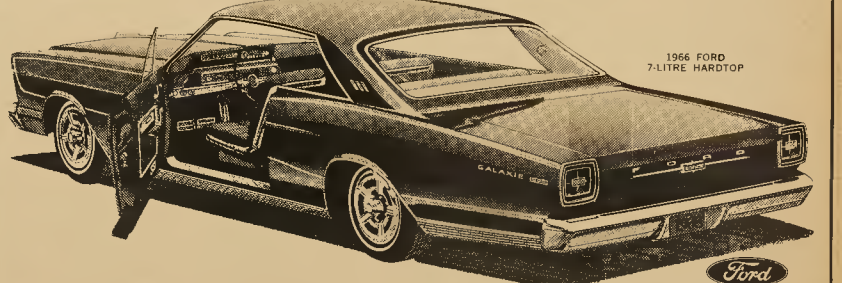
