

IN TRUST

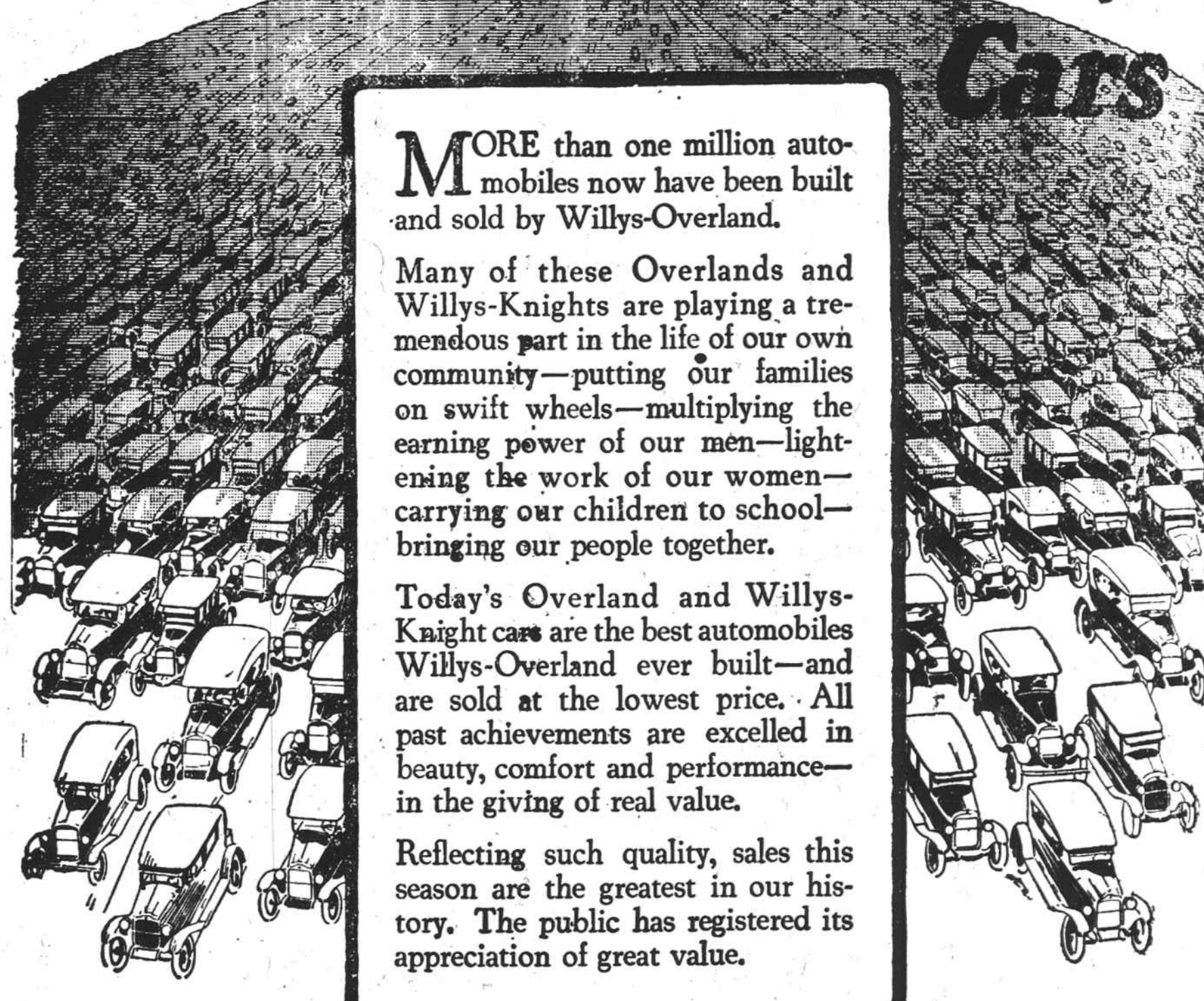

LEMON PIE.
3tablespoons flour
1 cup sugar
1-2 teaspoon salt
1 cup boiling water
1 tablespoon butter
3 egg yolks
Juice of one lemon.
Sift together flour, sugar, and salt; add boiling water and stir until smooth and boiling; add butter, the yolks beaten light and mixed with the lemon juice.

MERINGUE FOR LEMON PIE
3 egg whites
5 tablespoons sugar
1 tablespoon lemon juice.
Beat the white dry, then gradually beat in the sugar and lemon juice.

RHUBARB PIE
1 egg
1 1-2 cups sugar
2 tablespoons flour
1-2 teaspoon salt
2 cups sliced rhubarb
2 teaspoons butter
Either 1-2 cup of raisins or grated pineapple.
Beat the egg; beat in the sugar, pineapple flour and salt; mix with the rhubarb, raisins, or pineapple, and turn into a plate lined with pastry add the butter in bits, here and there cover and bake about 25 minutes.
