Department will be open from 8:00 A. M. until 6:00 P. M. Prospective Club Members should call at the department the very minute they decide to enter the campaign or, as early thereafter as possible and let the campaign manager give them such instructions as will be very beneficial to them.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- The campaign officially opens on August 25th and will extend over a period of eight weeks only.
- Any white person over 14 years of age, who is of good moral character, and is a resident of this or adjoining counties, married or unmarried, old or young, is eligible to compete in this Salesmanship Club campaign. Children under 14 years of age are allowed to enter only with the consent and assistance of their parents or guardians.
- No salaried employee of the Jackson County Journal, or member of the employee's immediate family, can enter to compete for any of these prizes. The Jackson County Journal reserves the right to reject any nomination.
- Credits cannot be purchased in this campaign. Every dollar accepted through the campaign department must represent a subscription payment.
- Free credit coupons will be printed in the Jackson County Journal each issue, which, when neatly cut out, and name filled in, and brought or mailed to the campaign department of The Jackson County Journal, will count for the number of credits printed thereon.
- No statement or promise made by any representative or candidate varying from the rules and regulations as published in the columns of this paper, will be recognized by the campaign department. Should any question arise, the decision of the management will be absolute and final.
- The list of the candidates nominated, together with the number of credits turned in for nomination, will be published from time to time.
