Dear Editor: Our community once enjoyed the privilege of a two teacher branch school we having a very good school building within the distance of one mile of every child in our community. The same having been seated with patent desks with the understanding that our children were to reap the benefit thereof.

About the time of the origin of a welfare officer in Jackson county, our school was reduced to a one teacher and the fourth grade. Later the question of consolidation arose. Some goober-pea eyed fellow just swiped our little school out of existence, and having hauled off the desks, leaving a number of children in our community from the age of six to twelve, the distance of three or four miles from school, whose parents are paying a very high tax to support a school four miles away. We seeing the necessity of schooling our children we feel like our children are just as worth of some arrangement as to their conveyance to school as other communities which have the special arrangements. We will thank the editor if these remarks are in print and we ask that these remarks be considered by men of authority.

We are using a vaccine that immunizes for life and one vaccination is all that is necessary for a calf.

Some man in each community should have an instrument and I will gladly go and spend time enough with him to show him how best to use it. It will be impossible for me to reach every man in the county so that I will have to work through some other person in each community.

If your calves have not been vaccinated please see me or Mr. Nicholson at once.
