

OVER 125,000 PEOPLE VISITED OUR PARK DURING AUGUST

Travel to the Great Smoky Mountains National Park for the month of August totalled 125,672, according to an estimate by park officials. A traffic count taken at one of the six entrances to the park resulted in a count of 31,246 automobiles carrying 104,727 people. Estimating that 25 per cent additional people came into the park at the other five entrances, a total figure of 125,672 is estimated, an increase of 24.3 per cent over the same month last year.

Automobiles from 46 states, the District of Columbia, and Canada were counted, with 42 per cent of visitors being from states other than Tennessee and North Carolina.

Practically all of the 31,246 automobiles and 104,727 people visited Sylva and Jackson county.
