**WINTER ADDS NEW
 POULTRY BURDENS**

The winter management and feeding of poultry places an important burden on the shoulders of North Carolina farmers, declares C. F. Parrish, extension poultryman at State college.

In a radio talk on the Carolina Poultry Features program Friday, December 18, Mr. Parrish will describe the best methods of caring for birds during the cold weather.

It is during the winter months that baby chicks are hatched and started. The grower who pays careful attention to the selection of quality eggs for hatching and then feeds and manages the chicks properly is in a good position to make a substantial profit from his birds.

However, says Parrish, the farmer who uses haphazard methods of selecting eggs is likely to get a decimated crop of pullets and cockerels.

If possible, the poultrymen should purchase his chicks from an accredited hatchery. Then the chance of having a poor quality flock will be minimized.

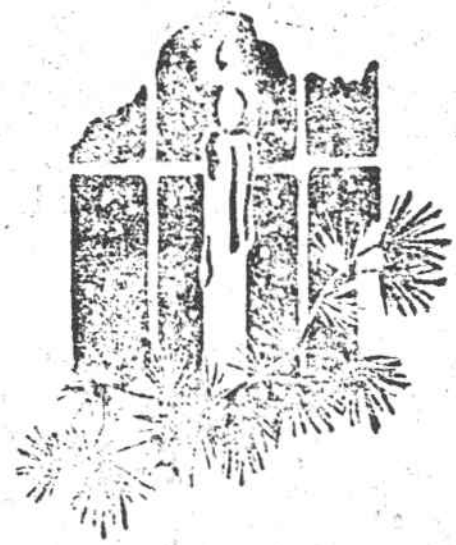
