

THE FRUITS OF ADVERTISING

Are Beginning to Appear—A Report of the New York Agent of Immigration, JOHN T. PATRICK, Gen. Im. Agent of the State of North Carolina—DEAR SIR—

I began to advertise the advantages of North Carolina for settlers last September in several of the widely circulated papers of New York.

The real work of my agency may be regarded as having begun on the first of November, and this report is chiefly for the two months ending 31st December, 1883.

Of this number, also, are the representatives of a number of Europeans, mostly French, led by Mr. R. A. Bonhomme, who in connection with my agency has organized a colony to locate in North Carolina.

A very prominent French gentleman who recently went back to Europe for a time, has been appointed to represent this agency and especially the Bonhomme silk and wine colony, among the French people.

A prominent Frenchman, also, now head of an immigration and land bureau in St. Paul, Minn., has made application and been appointed to represent the North Carolina agency among the people of the Northwest, many of whom are so anxious to remove to the South to escape the severe winters and disastrous storms of that section.

With ten years' observation and experience in the pioneering work of settling and immigration into the Southern States, I am now convinced that the right policy is to secure chiefly that class of people who have intelligence, courage and means sufficient to secure and build up occupations and industries on their own account.

My general rule is to seldom to send any one South who has not means to pay his or her own transportation.

I think now that I can send 1000 good people into the State during the year 1884. If so, it will add materially to the wealth and progress of the State.
