## Gay official could win post

WASHINGTON — President Clinton is poised to nominate Roberta Achtenberg, a gay San Francisco official, to be assistant secretary for fair housing and equal opportunity, government officials said Wednesday.

If she is confirmed, she will be the highest-ranking executive branch official in history who is an acknowledged homosexual.

"She is the intended nominee," one government official said, speaking on condition of anonymity.

White House Press Secretary Dee Dee Myers said she could not confirm the report, but said Clinton thinks highly of Achtenberg. "I can't comment on that until an announcement might be ready," Myers said.

But a White House source, who asked not to be identified, said Achtenberg "is slated for that post, yes." The source cautioned that the announcement was not imminent and that Clinton could change his mind.

In 1990, Achtenberg was elected to the San Francisco Board of Supervisors, which functions as the city council. Achtenberg, 42, spent more than 15 years as a lawyer and executive of gay-rights advocacy groups.

She lives with her partner, Mary Morgan, presiding judge of the San Francisco Municipal Court. They have a 7-year-old son but will not say which of them is the biological mother.

In 1989, Achtenberg legally represented a lesbian couple, Millie Jensen and Sue Pavlik, who won the right to adopt a 2-year-old boy with AIDS. Achtenberg accused Alameda County adoption workers of fraud dragging in the case.

Achtenberg currently is undergoing an FBI background check. Upon its completion, an announcement will come from the White House, the government official said.

The appointment of Achtenberg to the post in the Department of Housing and Urban Development, which pays \$115,700 a year, requires Senate confirmation.

Achtenberg is not expected to face trouble there. She would have to be approved by the Senate Banking, Housing and Urban Affairs committees, where she has the backing of Sen. Barbara Boxer, D-Calif. New York Sen. Alfonse D'Amato, the ranking Republican, is not expected to oppose the appointment.

However, Achtenberg may face trouble from housing public interest groups. Representatives of several of these groups met last week with Housing Secretary Henry Cisneros and voiced concern about what they said was Achtenberg's lack of experience in fair housing law, according to The Washington Blade, a gay weekly.

## Frat members charged with assault

RALEIGH — Members of a fraternity at St. Augustine's College sexually assaulted a woman last fall during a membership ritual, according to the woman's testimony in court.

The student said she told administration officials about the hazing and assault but went to police two weeks later when it became apparent that "everybody on campus wanted to keep it quiet."

Five members of Alpha Phi Alpha fraternity and two women have been charged with hazing. Three of the men were charged with assault on a female.

Court testimony revealed that the young woman and 13 other women were going through initiation ceremonies to become "sweethearts" when they were all hazed on Oct. 28. The women were blindfolded and led into different rooms where they were teased, touched or ordered to undress, testimony showed.

Charged with hazing and assault on a female are: Terry and Troy Parker, 23-year-old twins; and Greg Boyd, 23.

Samantha Endonna Goldsmith, 21; Lafonya Mitchener; Rinaldo Antonio Montgomery, 24, and Carlos Wayne Robinson, 22, are charged with hazing. Their trials are expected to begin this week.

year period. The money goes into a discretionary fund controlled by Chancellor Paul Hardin.

Hardin used approximately \$30,000 generated by the basketball team last year to help the UNC library.

"We didn't have to give the University of North Carolina the money, and we're being painted as the bad guy," said David Lohse, assistant sports information director.

Swofford attributes the high cost of the bowl game to the expense of transportation and lodging for the 477 students and 211 others who attended.

Most area residents traveled by car or bus, but some out-of-state students were flown to Atlanta at departmental expense, according to athletic department officials.

The 300 band members who traveled to the bowl were housed in the Days Inn at \$35 per night, while players, coaches and all others stayed at the Marriott Marquis, Swofford said. Peach Bowl officials stipulated that players and coaches stay in the hotel, which charged \$65 a night for players and coaches during their stay in Atlanta. The hotel charged \$85 a night for all other University guests.

Food costs were estimated at \$110,000, with players and coaches receiving \$47.50 per day.

In addition to the travel, food and lodging costs, the athletic department also paid for "award" items for each UNC player. All players received a UNC-bought commemorative jersey, which cost \$17 each, a Peach Bowl ring, at a cost of \$135 each and a Starter

brand Peach Bowl parka.

NCAA regulations allow for a maximum \$300 per player expenditure for "awards," Lohse said.

Players also received special memorabilia from the Peach Bowl, including a watch commemorating the 25th anniversary of the bowl game.

In addition to the players, coaches, band and cheerleading squad, the athletic department picked up a two-day tab for a large group of UNC administrators and faculty members.

"Those people have been a great part of building its success over the past three years," Swofford said. "While some may quarrel with my decision to invite them, I still feel it was appropriate."

Vice chancellors, Educational Foundation representatives, Athletic Council members, University trustees and Faculty Committee on Athletics members and their families who wished to attend the game were provided with tickets and two days' lodging.

"I'm not saying that the money saved by a touch of economy should go to the faculty," Ludington said. "These guys are not villains, but they need to work out some guidelines."

The University currently has no guidelines for athletic-trip expenditures, Lohse said. Swofford and his assistants drew up a list of invited guests and provided for their accommodation depending on the individual event, he said.

"Something like (UNC's appearance in the Peach Bowl) doesn't happen often, so a guideline isn't needed," he said.

view," McClellan said. "We do our review and send it to Washington."

Millard said that even if federal funds were granted, the AIDS Service Agency would need to secure other funds to operate the hospice, which would cost \$50,000 per year. The money would be used to hire 24-hour caretakers for the patients, he said.

Millard said state funds provided only \$30 per day per AIDS hospice resident. Patients needed \$70 per day, and the AIDS Service Agency must raise the difference, he said.

"It's stupid from the state's point of view," Millard said. "They should be supporting this sort of thing."

Morgan said opposition from Carrboro residents was a typical reaction to a proposal like the AIDS hospice.

"It is not unusual to have strong reaction from adjacent neighborhoods to any new development," he said. "It is very typical in Carrboro and Chapel Hill."

The AIDS Service Agency chose Carrboro as the site of the new home because of the town's growing number of AIDS victims, Millard said.

"There are a lot of people in Chapel Hill and Carrboro with the AIDS virus," Millard said. "This is not a homeless shelter. This is a hospice. This is for people who are dying."

Millard said the first site for the hospice was Chapel Hill, but HUD did not approve the selected site for the new building.
