Named Athlete of Year

USA Basketball Honors Crawley for Performances In International Play

Former North Carolina basketball player Sylvia Crawley was the recipient of the 1995 USA Basketball Female Athlete of the Year Award.

Although she wasn't highly recruited coming out of Stuebinville High School in Winterville, Ohio, the 6-foot-5 Crawley made great strides during her Tar Heel career. As a senior, she was the starting center for the UNC squad that won the 1994 ACC championship and the NCAA title. She was also a member of the silver medal-winning USA Women's World medal-winning USA Women's World University Games Team this summer in

University Games Team this summer in Fukuoka, Japan.

The World Games team posted a 6-1 record. Crawley started all seven games and was second on the team in scoring (19.1 points per game), and tied for third on the team in rebounds (5.9). She led the ward in blocked shorts and was second in on the team in rebounds (5.9). She led the squad in blocked shots and was second in steals. She shot 53.5 percent from the field and 72. 4 percent from the charity stripe. She was the leading scorer against Yugoslavia (25 points) and Italy (22).

"Sylvia did an outstanding job at the World University Games; she played extremely well in all seven games," said UNC coach Sylvia Hatchell, who was also the U.S. head coach at the World Games U.S. head coach at the World Games.

"She was voted captain and did a superb
job in the leadership role. She was an
extension of the coaching staff and always
led by example. She made sure everyone
always had the right attitude and that everyone was on the same page with goals
and objectives." and objectives."

Earlier in '95, Crawley earned a spot on the USA Women's Pan American Games Team that was to have competed in Argen tina in March. Not enough teams entered, however, and the women's basketball com-petition was cancelled just before it was scheduled to start. During the summer of

94, Crawley was a member of a USA Select Team that finished 3-1. She led the team in scoring twice in four games.

Crawley played professionally in France during the 1994-95 season.

Crawley scored 1,158 career points and grabbed 582 rebounds at UNC. Her career field goal percentage of 51.4 percent is fifth in school history, and her 123 blocked shots are third in the UNC record books.

Former UNC Standout Bullets' Webber Shows Wallace NBA Ropes

SHEPHERDSTOWN, W.Va. — In only two years in the NBA, Chris Webber has been traded twice, gone through three sets of contract talks and feuded with his

At the ripe age of 22, Webber is ready to help his new Washington Bullets team-mate, Rasheed Wallace, avoid similar pit-falls.

"Everybody has a lot to learn, but being a rookie is a real sensitive situation," Webbersaid Monday, shortly after signing a six-year, \$59 million deal.

"Here's a guy who's one of the four best players in college going into the NBA," he said of Wallace. "I'm really not the type of guy to give a lot of advice, but if he needs guy to give a lot of advice, but if he needs me, I'm there. The worst thing you can have is a guy who thinks he knows it all." It didn't take long for Webber to teach Wallace a few things on the court during

the team's preseason scrimmage at Shep

In the first quarter, Webber skied over

the rookie big man for a dunk.

Webber proceeded to lead his blue squad to an 84-64 victory over the white team, which included Wallace and the Bullets'

other coveted youngster, Juwan Howard.
"I've played with Rasheed already, so I know he probably wouldn't take it the wrong way," Webber said.

"We were out there goofing off and orking hard, and it wasn't really me showing him up or him trying to show me up. He's the one I'll be going to war with. That's my big fella."

Wallace understood. "That was all in fun," he said. "I do it,

Wallace, the fourth pick in the 1995 draft out of North Carolina, had a pair of dunks in the second half, the second a omahawk slam off a no-look pass from

"I think by having Chris, Juwan and myself on the court we can have contests with stufflike dunks or rebounds," Wallace said. "It will help us on the court

Webber, a member of the Fab Five with Howard at Michigan, said he was impressed with Wallace's athletic ability.

"He's going to be one of the ones out there with me and Juwan. It's going to be great," Webber said.

After two tumultuous years in the NBA, Webber said he finally feels at home. The

6-foot-10 forward will be playing with a secure contract, in front of fans who adore him and for an owner who admires him.

Webber, traded from Orlando to Golder webber, traded from Oriando to Golden State during the 1993 draft, didn't find happiness in California. After feuding with then-coach Don Nelson, he forced the Warriors to trade him to the Bullets in

The one-year contract he signed with Washington left him with an uncertain

future, until Monday.

"I've been on like an emotional roller. coaster," Webber said.

He spent much of the offseason working on conditioning, which clearly showed in

his bulked-up body.
"I lifted more than I ran," Webber said.
"Eight weeks before the season began ... I started a running program. After two years in the NBA, I think I know what it takes to


