

Despite increased hype in preseason, pressure 'not an issue' for Tar Heels

The UNC football team has been ranked No. 3 by one preseason publication.

As the 1997 football season approaches, it's logical to think North Carolina's players and coaches might be getting a little hot under the collar.

After all, 15 starters return from last year's 10-2, Gator Bowl-champion squad. Nine of those starters play on a defense that ranked at the top of the ACC and led the country in scoring defense last season.

The offense, while returning only six first-teamers, has a wealth of experience at plenty of skill positions — namely quarterback and receiver. And the University has doled out millions to transform Kenan Stadium into a premier venue.

To top it off, one preseason magazine has ranked the Tar Heels third in the nation, and other such ratings likely will follow.

Needless to say, the spotlight is on UNC football — and it's only June. But despite the increased attention and

expectations, the Tar Heels aren't sweating a drop. In fact, some players shun the concept of pressure altogether.

"Pressure will not be an issue," UNC cornerback Dre' Bly said at a Tuesday press conference. "We like pressure; we perform to the pressure."

If any Tar Heel would feel any pressure, it would be Bly. Sure, team expectations will be high, but Bly faces the monumental task of repeating as the country's interception leader. Last season, the sophomore from Chesapeake, Va., grabbed 11 interceptions en route to earning first-team All-America honors.

But instead of focusing on a personal agenda, Bly — like many of his teammates — looks at the bigger picture.

"I'm not worried about (individual marks)," he said. "As long as I do my job and we're winning, I'm happy."

Then there's the whole issue of stadium construction. As people across the nation have started paying increased attention to UNC football, the University decided to give the Tar Heels a state-of-the-art stage on which to perform.

All the building at Kenan will take over a year to complete. But work on the Chancellor's box and on Educational Foundation seating has proceeded on schedule, and the lower level of the new

football center also will be ready for action when the season begins.

To UNC coach Mack Brown, the school's \$35 million-plus outlay represents a major vote of confidence for a program looking to crack college football's upper echelon.

"The new stadium project is really exciting for us," Brown said. "It's by far the biggest show of commitment in the nine years I've been here."

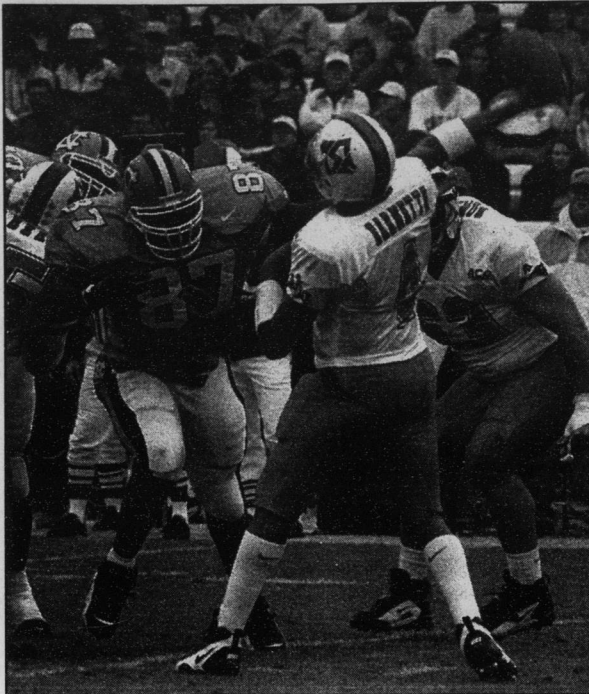
The coaches' offices are expected to be completed in December, while the stadium seating will be finished next year to bring Kenan's capacity to 60,000.

Moreover, the construction also represents the Tar Heels' reward for several years of improvement.

"When you get through working out, and you look out and see they're building something partly because of what you did, it's incredible," said Kivunusama Mays, a key cog in a linebacker corps one magazine rated the nation's best.

And although the season is more than 12 weeks away, annual chatter about the Florida State game already has begun. With its bevy of experienced players, some say the Tar Heels might have their best shot yet to topple the Seminoles in November.

But the Tar Heels remember last year's simple plan of taking it one game

at a time, and they recall how well that unit worked. "I don't get into (preseason predic-

tions," cornerback Robert Williams said. "Right now, all I'm thinking about is Indiana."

Football to play on TV 6 times in 1997 season

UNC might have four more contests televised regionally or nationally.

The North Carolina football team will be playing in a minimum of four nationally televised games in the first nine weeks of the 1997 season.

The Tar Heels, who have been ranked third in Athlon's preseason poll, will be seen on ESPN2 the first two Saturdays of September against Indiana and Stanford, respectively.

Jefferson-Pilot Sports will carry UNC's first road game of the season, against Maryland on Sept. 20.

UNC will play Virginia at home on Sept. 27 on either ABC or ESPN.

The Georgia Tech and FSU games, scheduled for Oct. 30 and Nov. 8, respectively, will also air on ESPN.

Four games — Wake, NCSU, Clemson and Duke — do not have designated kickoff times as of yet. Networks will not select any of these games for TV until 12 days before each contest.

Twenty-one of the Tar Heels' last 24 games have been televised.
