

ABC, CBS Want Own Presidential Debates

NEW YORK — Executives at ABC and CBS said Tuesday they will not broadcast presidential debates organized by rival networks CNN and NBC, as proposed by Republican candidate George W. Bush.

Instead of agreeing to three 90-minute, nationally televised debates in October, as proposed by the

Commission on Presidential Debates, Bush has said he will participate in one of those debates and two others suggested by NBC and CNN.

One would match the two contenders in a prime-time version of NBC's Sunday morning talk show, "Meet the Press," moderated by Tim Russert. The other would be an edition of Larry King's talk show on CNN.

The Gore campaign has said it will

not agree to Bush's plan unless Bush also commits to all three commission debates with their potentially wide viewership.

The Dole-Clinton debates in 1996 drew television audiences of 46 million and 36 million, according to the commission. One of the Bush-Clinton debates in 1992 drew 97 million viewers and one of the Dukakis-Bush debates in 1988 had 67 million viewers.

prosecuting multiple defendants accused of the same violation in one hearing.

"Right now, they have the option of going separately," Lea said.

"It's a lot of work. We're trying to join them unless they can show reason for a separate hearing."

Lea said the judicial system is also looking into accepting plea bargains for students accused of cheating or possession of marijuana.

Students facing charges such as these could bypass such a hearing by accepting the normal sanctions, or punishments.

But Lea said Student Congress and the Faculty Council would have to approve the option before it could be

implemented next summer at the earliest.

In the meantime, Lea said counsels are doubling up on cases in order to handle the increased number of complaints.

"We're all pretty stressed right now."

Board Agrees on Housing Plan

Carrboro aldermen voted unanimously to consider several town-owned lots for affordable housing.

CARRBORO — The Carrboro Board of Aldermen hopes that the cost of affordable housing will be eased by constructing on town lots.

The aldermen unanimously passed an amended resolution Tuesday night to establish a policy to determine which town-purchased land can be dedicated to affordable housing.

The land must be purchased by the town for municipal uses, and the aldermen decided to implement the policy only when feasible for affordable housing.

One piece of land the aldermen considered using is a 9-acre area on Hillsborough Road, currently the Hillsborough Road Neighborhood Park.

Mayor Mike Nelson said he would have supported the concept for using

the land for parks but said questions will have to be answered before he will be completely satisfied with the policy.

"I have reservations about this particular example," he said.

"We need to decide on a piece of property over certain acres be set for affordable housing."



Carrboro Mayor Mike Nelson said each piece of property should be evaluated independently.

Alderman Alex Zaffron said affordable housing issues should be addressed on a case-by-case basis and that the town should consolidate its assets before defining a strategy.

But Alderman Jacquelyn Gist said the Hillsborough Road Neighborhood Park property is not a good area for affordable housing.

"It's really not pragmatic," she told the board. "We've gone so far with the designer and we're so close to having community-based meetings."

"It's not a suitable site, and it gets smaller when you look at what it is and what it contains."

Alderman Mark Dorosin said the town needs to examine all its land to find out what can be adequately used.

"We need to inventory town-owned property," he said.

"Maybe some is suitable for affordable housing, maybe some isn't."

Dorosin also said the land was the biggest expense and that even developing one house at a time would help move the cause along.

Alderman Joal Broun encouraged flexibility in their decision to help determine each case.

"If we set rigid standards, we'll have little room for flexibility later on," she said.

Alderman Diana McDuffee said the policy should be extended so the board can consider ways for creating affordable housing options, on or off town-owned land.

"We should be alert to opportunities to contribute to affordable housing."
