■ A 20-year-old man was shot outside of the Tau Epsilon Phi fraternity house, 216 E. Rosemary St., about 2:50 a.m. Sunday, according to Chapel Hill police reports.

The man was shot once in the left shoulder by a small-caliber handgun, and he then was taken to UNC Hospitals where he was treated and released, reports state.

According to reports, the incident occurred after a fight took place that morning between the suspect and the victim's brother.

The suspect is described as a black male in his early 20s, who is about 5 feet 5 inches tall and has long dreadlocks, according to reports.

Anyone who has information about the incident is urged to contact the Chapel Hill Police Department and speak with inves-

tigator R.W. Mathews.

■ A Miami Subs employee was arrested at 12:04 a.m. Sunday on charges of marijuana possession, Chapel Hill police reports state.

Alexander Smith, 29, of 200 Westminister Drive was arrested at a traffic stop on Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard for driving with a suspended license, according to reports.

A vehicle search found that Smith had 1.8 grams of marijuana in a Dutch Masters cigar box, reports state.

Smith was released on written promise and is set to appear in District Criminal Court in Chapel Hill on March 7, reports state.

■ University police arrested a Chapel Hill man wanted for fel-

ony theft shortly after midnight Sunday, according to University police reports.

An officer stopped Lloyd Carrol Vance on Country Club Road for running a stoplight and for exceeding the posted speed limit. After the officer called in Vance's information, a dispatcher confirmed that Vance had active warrants in Douglas County, Ga., reports state.

The Douglas County sheriff was then contacted, and the officer at the scene arrested Vance for a fugitive warrant, according to reports.

After being taken before the Orange County magistrate, Vance was given a secured bond for \$10,000 and was taken into custody at the Orange County Jail, reports state.

His trial is set for Wednesday in Hillsborough, according to reports.
