

**Dinner** Special Rabbit (Makes six ½-cup servings) Dash cayenne pepper Dash Tabasco sauce 1/2 cup hot water 3 (8-oz.) bars Natural Cheddar Cheese 1 egg, well beaten

1 teaspoon dry mustard

Butter the inside of double boiler top. Pour in hot water. Add shredded cheese. Place over hot, not boiling, water. Cook, stirring vigorously with a wooden spoon in one direction until the cheese is melted. This is important for best results. Blend in seasonings. Continue to stir while very gradually adding the beaten egg. Quickly pour into chafing dish which has been warming over gently bubbling hot water. To serve, spoon over golden-brown toast points. Rabbit is at its best when served immediately after cooking.

NOTE: If desired, a large cast iron skillet may be used instead of the double boiler. In this case, prepare the rabbit according to directions, placing skillet over *low* heat.
