

Time Extended For Comments Untied Tobacco

The U. S. Department of Agriculture has announced that the time for submitting views and comments on a proposed change in price support regulations on untied flue-cured tobacco has been extended from April 23 to May 15.

USDA announced on March 27 that consideration is being given to changes which would make price supports available on untied tobacco on a limited and experimental basis during the first sale days on all South Carolina markets and the Border Belt markets in North Carolina.

During that time, supports would be available only on lugs, including primings and nondescript grades thereof. Thereafter, price support will be available on all tobacco, including lugs and primings, but only in tied form.

Price support grade loan rates for tobacco offered in untied form would be less than the rates for the same grades offered in tied form. During 1961 season, the differential between grades of flue-cured tobacco marketed untied in marketed tied elsewhere was \$6.00 per hundredweight.

USDA invited the views and comments of tobacco producers, warehousemen, manufacturers, dealers and other interested persons relative to the proposed change. In order to afford all interested persons additional time to submit views and comments, the final date for submission has been extended to May 15.

Views and comments should be submitted in writing and should be reviewed by Murray Thompson, Director, Price Division, Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service, U. S. Department of Agriculture, Washington 25, D. C., no later than May 15, 1962.

Motor Vehicles Department Lists Distress Measures

The Motor Vehicles Department has released a list of standard distress measures to be used by motorists on the Interstate highway system.

Adopted by the American Association of State Highway Officials (AASHO) the tips will help insure safety and prompt assistance for motorists who encounter trouble.

The measures are as follows:

1. In an emergency on free-ways, drivers should stop their cars on the right hand shoulder, whenever possible, well away from the through traffic lanes.
2. At night the tail lights and the interior lights of the stopped vehicle should be on. If the vehicle is equipped with an emergency switch controlling the signal lights they should be turned on so that both right and left signals flash simultaneously.
3. If a car is stopped in all or part of the traffic lane, portable warning devices should be placed to the rear of the stopped car to warn other traffic.
4. When help is needed, a white cloth or handkerchief can be displayed from the stopped vehicle so that it can readily be seen. (Note: Most commonly a handkerchief is tied to the left door handle.) In addition the hood of the car should be raised.
5. Stay in the car while waiting for help.
6. After observing a distress signal, passing motorists should notify the nearest police, highway or automotive service official at the first convenient opportunity, giving the location of the motorist in need of help.

Ray A. Killian of Conover gave an address on "Pearls in Our Palms." He was introduced by Sam Warlick of Warrenton.

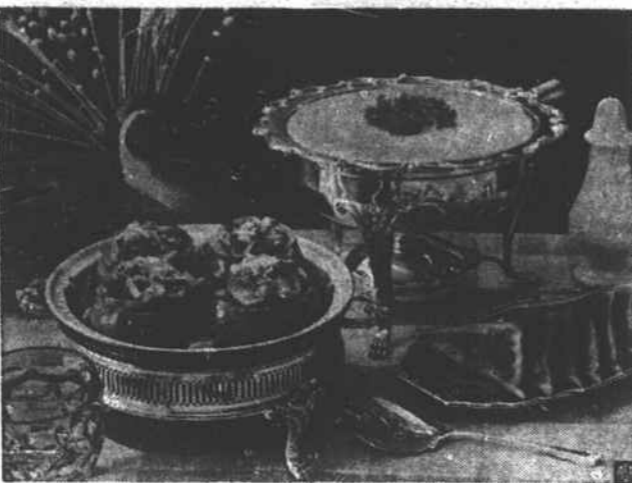

Cheese Rabbit A Real Treat



The cheese rabbit holds a distinctive position as a meal in itself, although it originally came to being in a different way. It is said that it first became known as a "rabbit" when unexpected guests dropped in on a hunter while he was cooking game he had bagged that day. To stretch the short meat supply, he added a concoction of melted cheese and told his guests that they were being served "Welsh Rabbit." Some however, prefer to call it a "rabbit." Call it what you will, but for best results follow this Borden Kitchen recipe accurately. Serve immediately over golden-brown toast points. To round out the menu, serve baked red-ripe tomatoes stuffed with canned mushrooms.

Dinner Special Rabbit (Makes six 1/4-cup servings)
1/2 cup hot water Dash cayenne pepper
3 (8-oz.) bars Natural Dash Tabasco sauce
Cheddar Cheese 1 egg, well beaten
1 teaspoon dry mustard

Butter the inside of double boiler top. Pour in hot water. Add shredded cheese. Place over hot, not boiling, water. Cook, stirring vigorously with a wooden spoon in one direction until the cheese is melted. This is important for best results. Blend in seasonings. Continue to stir while very gradually adding the beaten egg. Quickly pour into chafing dish which has been warming over gently bubbling hot water. To serve, spoon over golden-brown toast points. Rabbit is at its best when served immediately after cooking.

NOTE: If desired, a large cast iron skillet may be used instead of the double boiler. In this case, prepare the rabbit according to directions, placing skillet over low heat.

BOND ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$400,000 SCHOOL BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF WARREN

WHEREAS, the County Board of Education has determined that existing school plant facilities in the Warren County School Administrative Unit are not adequate for the maintenance of public schools for the nine months' school term prescribed by law, and has requested the Board of Commissioners to provide the sum of \$400,000 to finance additional school plant facilities such as are described in Section 1 of the Bond Order and which said County Board of Education has determined are necessary to enable the County of Warren, as an administrative agency of the public school system of the State of North Carolina, to maintain public schools in the Warren County School Administrative Unit for the nine months' school term prescribed by law: NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDERED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Warren as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Commissioners of the County of Warren as ascertained and hereby determines that it is necessary to erect in the Warren County School Administrative Unit several new buildings to be used as school houses, school garages, physical education and vocational education buildings, teacherages and lunchrooms and other school plant facilities, and to reconstruct and enlarge, by the erection of additions, several existing buildings located in such unit and used for such purposes, and to acquire land, furnishings and equipment necessary for such new or reconstructed or enlarged buildings in order to enable the County of Warren, as an administrative agency of the public school system of the State of North Carolina, to maintain public schools in said school administrative unit for the nine months' school term prescribed by law, and that it will be necessary to expend for such purposes not less than \$400,000 in addition to other moneys which have been made available therefor.

Section 2. In order to raise the money required to finance

the cost of erecting said new school buildings and of reconstructing and enlarging, by the erection of additions, said existing buildings, and of acquiring land and furnishings for such new and reconstructed and enlarged buildings, bonds of the County of Warren are hereby authorized and shall be issued pursuant to the County Finance Act of North Carolina. The maximum aggregate principal amount of said bonds authorized by this Bond Order shall be Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000).

Section 3. A tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds when due shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 4. A statement of the County debt of the County of Warren has been filed with the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners of said County and is open to public inspection.

Section 5. This Bond Order shall take effect when approved by the voters of the County at an election as provided in said Act.

The foregoing Bond Order has been introduced and a sworn statement has been filed under the County Finance Act, showing the assessed valuation of the County to be \$20,143,221.00, and the net debt for school purpose, including the proposed bonds, to be \$400,000.00. A tax will be levied for the payment of the proposed bonds and interest, if the same shall be issued.

Any citizen or taxpayer may protest against the issuance of such bonds at a meeting of the Board of Commissioners to be held at the regular meeting place of said Board in the commissioners' Room in the Warren County Courthouse in Warrenton, North Carolina, at 3:00 o'clock, P. M., on the 7th day of May, 1962, or an adjournment thereof.
